Irish Lose, Then Win

The Aquinas basketball team had a shooter's nightmare last Friday night as they lost their first game of the season, and then continued their "bad dream" type of basketball for three quarters Saturday night before they woke up in time to post victory number four. The Friday night loss came at the hands of Monroe (56-49) while the victory was a 49-47 verdict over Lyons Central.

In the Monroe game the Irish opened the contest by hitting on sixteen per cent of their field goal attempts in the first quarter.

By the time the final quarter had begun the Little Irish found themselves at the wrong end of a 46-34 score. Then, Aquinas staged a comeback and with less than three minutes to go the score stood at 49-49. However, there was no reward for the final quarter rally, as Monroe closed the scoring with seven points while Aquinas lowered its game shooting percentage to 30 per cent. Dick Barron led the Aquinas scorers with 16 points.

Against Lyons, Aquinas followed the previous night's script exactly. The Irish opened the game by falling behind quickly, shot poorly from the field (29.8), and staged another fourth quarter rally.

The comeback was sparked by a pressing defense, led by Paul Fiore, which destroyed Lyons' ball control tactics.

With seven seconds remaining in the game, and with the score standing at 47-47, Jim Brady topped the Aquinas comeback with the game-winning basket.

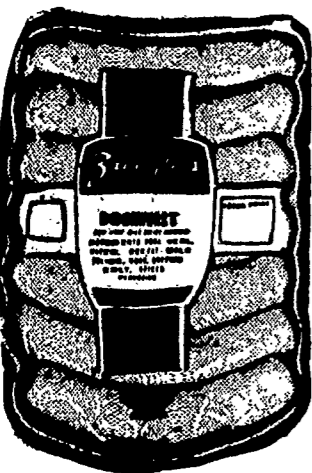
Brady, the hero, was also Brady, the high-scorer as he led Aquinas with 15.

Catholic Fives Paired In Memorial Twin-Bill

Scholastic cage fans can do some of their window-shopping at the War Memorial on Saturday night Dec. 17 when Rochester's four Catholic League schools get together for the first of 4 doubleheaders this season.

Cardinal Mooney, riding high on a 4-0 record, meets Bishop Kearney 1-3 in the 7 o'clock opener. Aquinas (4-1) takes on McQuaid (3-1) in the second game.

Though Ed Nietopski's Mooney squad would appear to be a strong choice in the first game, the Cardinals have a good-looking 1-2 punch in Jim Harrington and Otis Davis, with newcomer Doug Farrell scoring well in backcourt. Kearney, in its first season under Carm Urzetta, has gotten its most consistent scoring from Bruce Boss, sec-

onded by Tom Mangione and Steve Shales.

The Aquinas-McQuaid clash figures to be a close one, with the Knights' height advantage making them a slight pre-game choice. McQuaid has a pair of 6-4 leapers in John Koller and Nick Combs, with 6-4 Bob Weingartner completing the forward trio and 6-5 Paul Jones in reserve. Koller is also the top scoring threat among the four teams, showing 98 points in 4 games with a one-game high of 39 against Irondequoit on the Memorial court.

McQuaid Loses Thriller, 63-61

Franklin eked out a 63-61 win over McQuaid in the final minute of play on the Knights' court last Friday, dealing the Jesuits their first setback in 4 games.

The Knights were within 30 seconds of going into Saturday's game with Aquinas unbeaten. But Franklin's Mel Marshall hit on a layup with thatmuch time left on the clock to give the Quakers their decisive margin. His foul with 2 seconds left in the game made it a 2-point win.

McQuaid had jumped out to an 8-0 lead and Franklin had to play catch-up ball for the rest of the game. After leading

by 20-12 after one quarter, the Knights stretched their lead to 28-16 midway through the second period. But Franklin poured in 9 straight points to get back in the game and the half ended at 34-28.

The Quakers tied it at 36-36 early in the third quarter, but McQuaid again pulled away to a 5-point lead at 48-43. Again Franklin came back to tie, 54-54, but didn't grab his first lead until Gil Robinson's jumper with 1:55 left. Combs came back with a tip-in to make it 61-60, McQuaid, at the 1:05 mark, but then it was Franklin's turn, and the Quakers took it.

The scoring difference came on the foul line where Franklin made 11 for 21 compared to McQuaid's 9-3. Both teams got off 71 shots from the field, with McQuaid hitting 29 and Franklin 28. Franklin's Terry Jackson led all scorers with 19, while Marshall and Combs had 16 each. Weingartner (14) and Koller (13) were next in the Knight's scoring line.

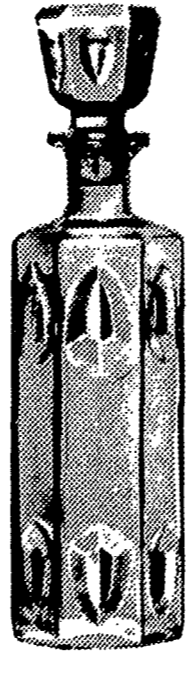

bleheader to be played at the War Memorial this Saturday, Dec. 17. Aquinas meets McQuaid in the second half of the twin bill.



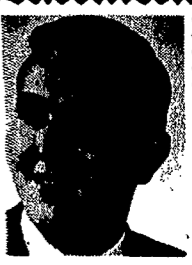

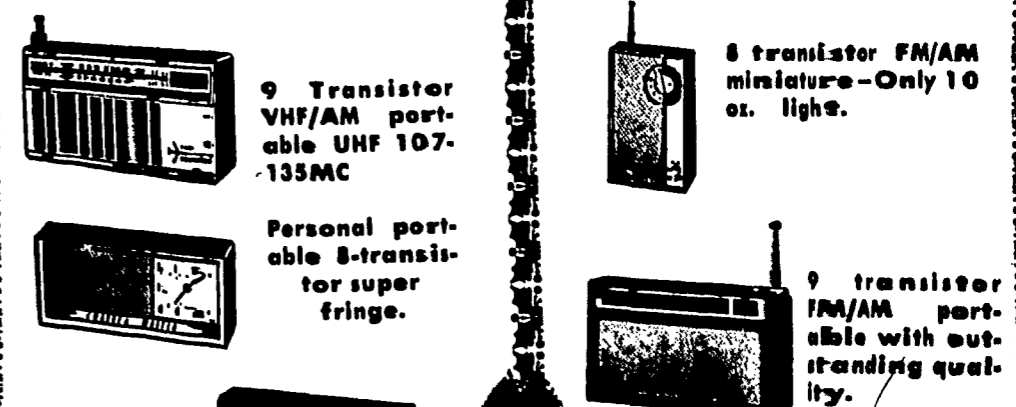
