"POP" ROLL YOUR OWN MANICOTTI

- 1/2 lb. Prince curly Lasagna (No. 14)
 - 1/2 cup Flavored Bread Crumb Mix
 - 1 lb. Ricotta or Cottage Cheese
 - 1 lb. Mozzarella
 - 1/4 tsp. salt
 - 1/4 cup Chopped Parsley
 - 1 egg slightly beaten
 - 1 pt. "Pop" Luciano Spaghetti Sauce (recipe below)
 - 1/4 cup Parmesan Grated Cheese
- Cook Lasagna according to package directions. Drain and cut Lasagna strips in half. Mix cheeses, Bread Crumbs, salt, parsley and egg. Spoon some of mixture on each Lasagna strip and roll. Pour 1/2 of Luciano sauce into shallow casserole and arrange rolls in single layers. Add remaining sauce, sprinkle with Grated Cheese, bake at 350 F. for 15 minutes or until bubbling hot. Serves 4-6.

LUCIANO SAUCE "POP" STYLE

- 3 tbl. olive oil or salad oil
 - 1 medium onion, chopped
 - 8 fresh mushrooms, sliced
 - 1/4 lb. ground beef
 - 1/2 cup burgundy (optional)
 - 2 1/2 cups water
 - 1-8 oz. can HUNT'S TOMATO PASTE
 - Salt and pepper
- Saute onion, mushrooms and ground beef in oil over low flame, stirring occasionally until light brown. Add burgundy and simmer about ten minutes until the wine has been reduced to half.  - 1 cup finely shredded red cabbage
 - 1 cup finely shredded green cabbage
 - 3/4 cup chopped celery
 - 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- In a large mixing bowl, combine Royal Gelatin and water, still until gelatin is dissolved (until jelly-like consistency). Mix together sour cream, vinegar and salt, add cabbage, celery and green pepper. Stir to gelatin and pour into mold. Cover and chill until set. Unmold on chilled plate with salad greens, garnish with carrot curls and radish roses.
