W. Gascoyne Cecil once told a story about the three Wise Men who came to the Child. They went in one at a time. One was old, one was middle-aged and one was young. When the old man went in, instead of finding the new-born babe he had expected, he found an old man who talked with him. When the middle-aged man went in, he was met by a teacher of his own years. When the young man entered, he in turn found a young prophet. The three met together outside of the stable and wondered why they had not found a Child but three men of different ages. So they went in together and were amazed to find what had come expecting to see, a Baby Who was only 12 days old.

What is the lesson of this story? It is that each saw in Christ the reflection of his own condition. The old man saw an old man, the middle-aged the middle-aged and the young the young. But when they went in together, they were able to see Christ as He is. We can personally find in Christ the answer to all our needs in all the periods of our life. But if we want to see Christ as He is today, we must approach Him in union with our fellow man.

Our age is one in which Christ is carried into other lands. As the Wise Men traveled from the East seeking Him, today we must look for Him hidden in the poor, the refugees, the sick, the disinherited of this world. As they sacrificed the comforts of their homes to find Him, so we cannot really see Him in the poor and suffering without sacrificing of our abundance. When you enter the stable this Christmas, may you see the Christ of your age—but remember that as the Wise Men saw Him He is poor at any age. God Love You!
