

Churches Pool Aid To Needy

New York—(NC)—"Relations with Roman Catholics moved forward significantly during 1966," according to the year-end report of activities of the World Council of Churches prepared by its office here.

The report cited as "an ecumenical first" the coordination of World Council relief programs with those of Catholic agencies for famine victims in India and Africa.

It also noted the progress made by a Catholic-WCC joint working group in studying theological issues that divide the churches and the nature and task of ecumenism.

New subcommittees, it announced, will begin studies on the question of proselytism, principles of religious liberty, and the problems of mixed marriages.

Stressed in the year-end summary of church activities prepared by Dr. Eugene L. Smith, executive secretary of the World Council of Churches in the United States, was the sharp manner in which the "dynamics of development were revealed to churches" during the year.

"The most dangerous tensions of the world today," Dr. Smith said, "exist between the affluent nations and the great tropical belt of developing nations." The churches in both types of nations have vital roles to play, he added.

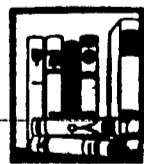

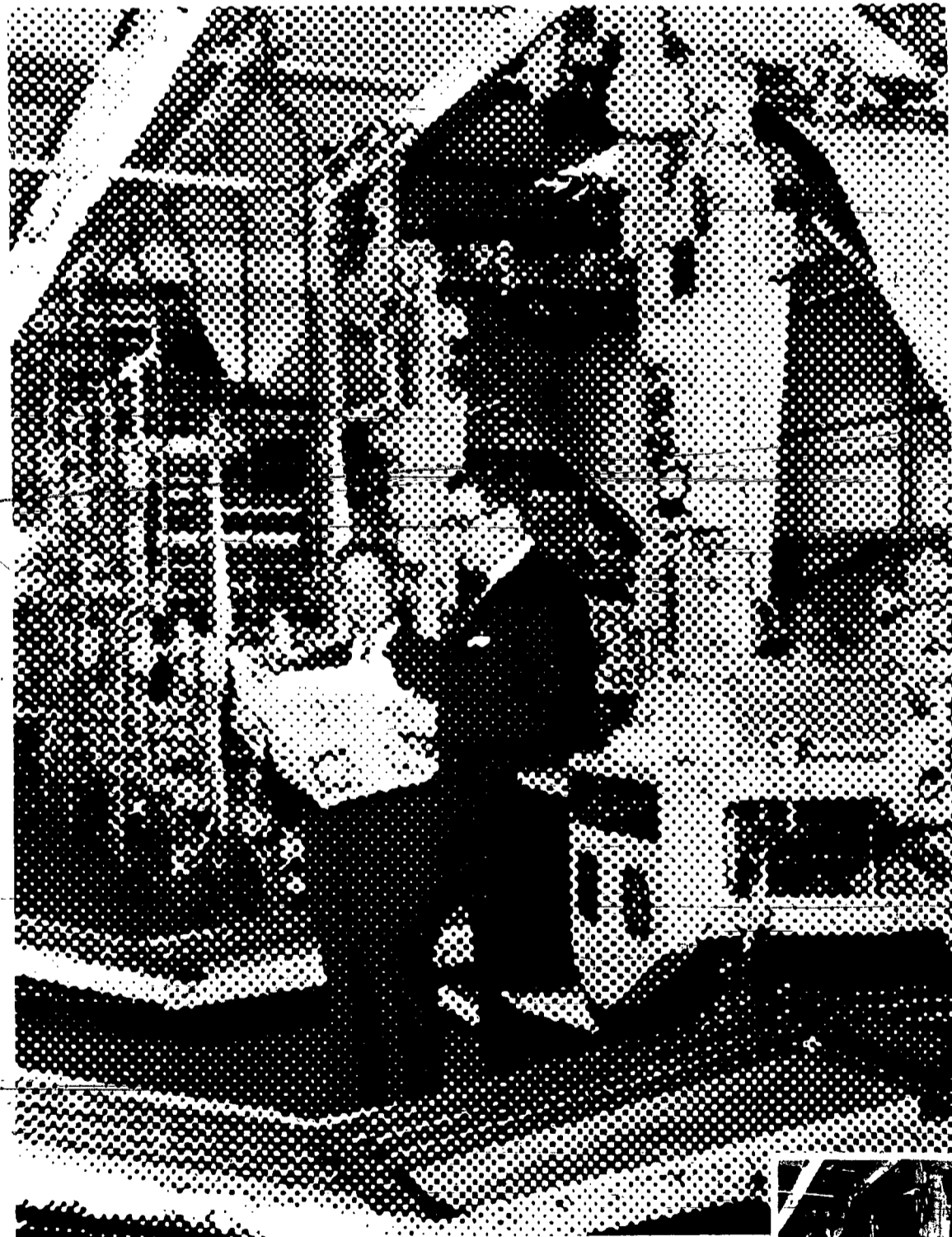

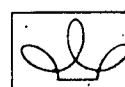
