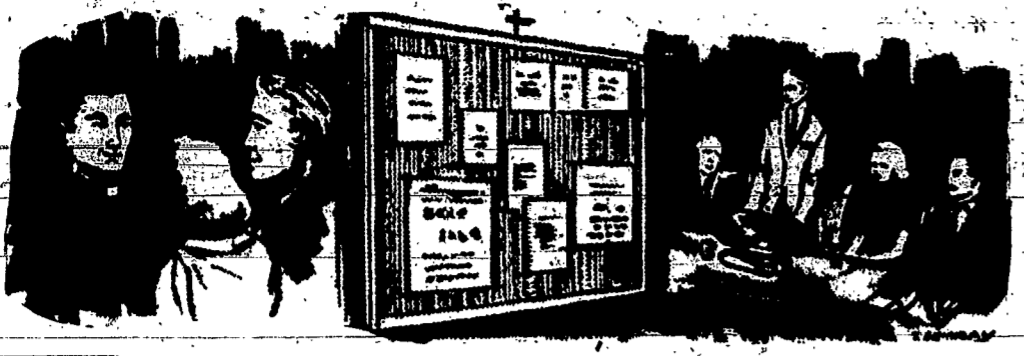

## Sister Pauline Rites Held at Motherhouse

Funeral Mass for Sister Pauline was offered by her nephew, Father John O'Donnell, in Nazareth Motherhouse Chapel, Wednesday, Jan. 4. Bishop Kearney gave the Final Absolution.

Sister Pauline, who died Jan. 1, 1967, was principal at Nazareth Academy from 1949 to 1953 and before that taught mathematics at the Academy for 10 years.

Sister taught at Cathedral High School, forerunner of Aquinas Institute and at Aquinas from 1913 to 1939.

She was also Aquinas Institute librarian. Sister also taught at St. Agnes High School in recent years.

Men and women in the area, prominent in civic, business and religious circles were her pupils.

Early in her career, Sister Pauline received her library science degree from the University of Buffalo, a master's degree from Canisius College, Buffalo and a doctorate in mathematics from St. Bonaventure University, near Olean.
