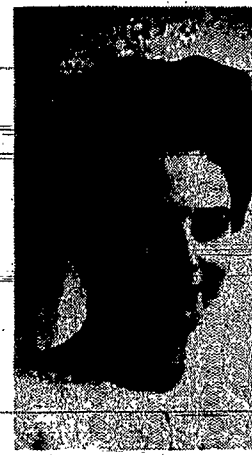
The Mulligan twins are freshmen. They are graduates of Mercy High School.

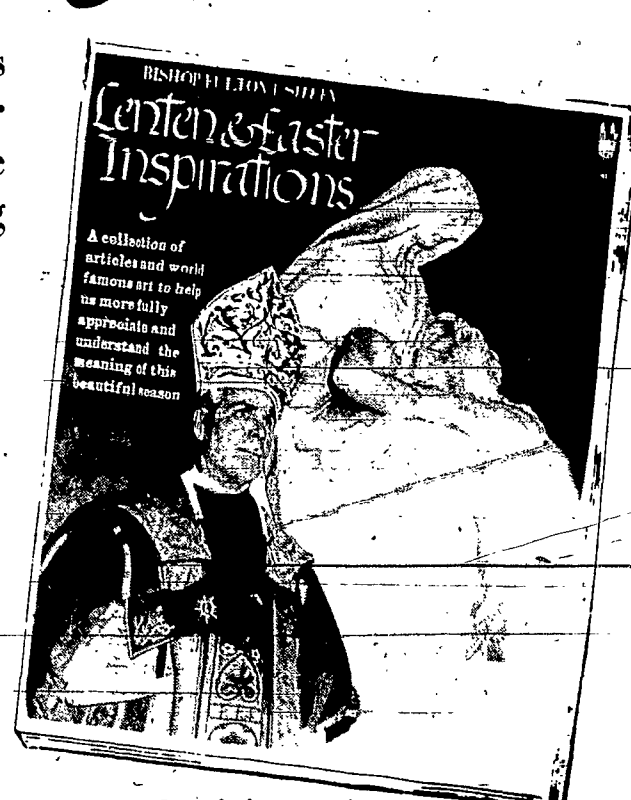
