

## Sister Immaculate Heart Russer Requiem at Dominic an Monastery

Sister Mary of the Immaculate Heart, O.P., one of the eight pioneer nuns who arrived in Elmira from Buffalo in 1944 to open the Dominican Monastery died Sunday, Jan. 15, 1967.

Funeral Mass was to be offered by Father Bernard C. Hanna, chaplain at the Monastery, 1310 W. Church St., Wednesday, Jan. 18.

The former Agnes Russer and Sister Mary Clare, O.P. (nee Eleanor Russer) helped to establish the Dominican Monastery in Elmira, founded by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert. The two nuns' mother, Mrs. Eleanor E. Russer of Rochester had a prominent role in the foundation.

Sister Mary of the Immaculate Heart was a graduate of Nazareth Academy and a member of St. Augustine's parish, Rochester before joining the Dominican Nuns of the Perpetual Rosary, a cloistered community.

Three years ago besides their daily schedule of prayer and devotions, the nuns at Rosary Hill began an annual tradition of baking cookies, to raise money for the monastery. Sister Mary of the Immaculate Heart was in charge of the bakery.

Last year they produced 4,100 pounds of Christmas cookies which were sold in Elmira and Rochester.

Besides her mother, Mrs. Max Russer, Sr., and her sister, St. Mary Clare, she is survived by a brother, Max O. Russer of Rochester; other sisters, Mrs. Clarence (Mary) Young, Mrs. Frank (Ruth) Carroll, Mrs. Robert (Esther) Egan, Mrs. Kenneth (Clare) Unger, Mrs. John (Barbara) Andrieu, Mrs. Eugene (Cliff) Schickler, 45 nieces and nephews, all of Rochester.

Burial was in St. Peter and Paul's Cemetery, Elmira. Arrangements by Keefe Funeral Home.

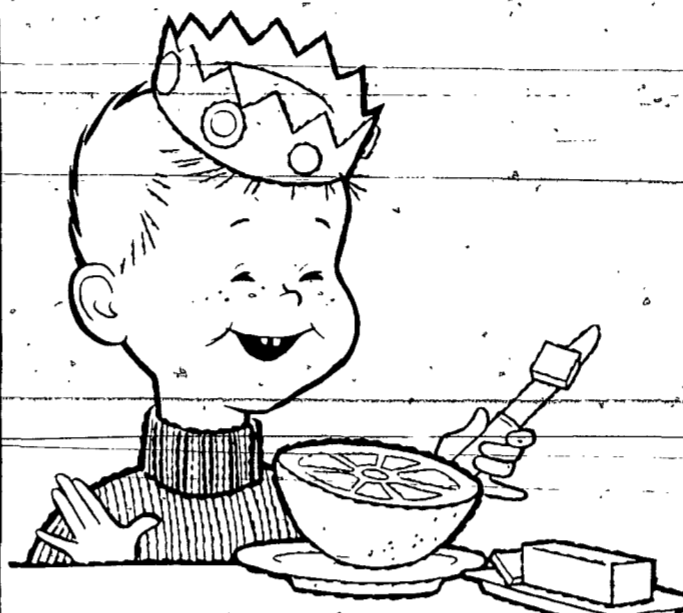
