St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians praising them, saying that though they were poor and impoverished, they gave far beyond their means to help the poor persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. He expressed it this way "First they gave themselves to the Lord." The surrender of themselves, preceded the surrender of anything they had. Man will be held accountable for what he does with himself, even more than what he does with his money. What a man does with his money is determined by what he does with himself. Anyone who gives himself to the Lord will always give to the Lord's poor.

We firmly believe that the poor of the world are helped just as much by the love that accompanies your gift, as by the gift itself.

If we can increase your love of God, we can increase aid for the increase of aid for the Missions without increasing your love of God, it is to fail in our vocation. If this column increases by just a spark your love of Christ and Him crucified in the midst of our humanity, you will send a sacrifice to the Holy Father.
