

A Waikiki Question --Where's Bishop Sheen?

The Courier's special correspondent in Honolulu, Hawaii, sent us the following item from the Sunday Star-Bulletin and Advertiser for Jan. 22, from the paper's Question Box edited by Bert Darr:

QUESTION: Please settle a dispute. I say Bishop Fulton Lewis Sheen, is dead and hasn't been in a television series for years. Also tell me something about him, and what was the name of his once popular show? Thanks. — Mrs. Lois Mack, Waikiki. (Also for Andrew T. Kearns, Honolulu.)

ANSWER: We hope you're not thinking of another well known broadcaster, by your use of "Lewis" in Sheen's name. Mutual commentator Fulton Lewis Jr. DID die last summer, BUT Bishop Fulton JOHN Sheen is still hale and hearty at the spry age of nearly 72. The erudite prelate, born in El Paso, ILLINOIS, May 8, 1895, holds about a dozen degrees from as many different universities. Sheen preached in London's Westminster Cathedral and lectured at Cambridge University, England, as well as conducted an NBC radio series and his popular TV programs in the 50s. Sheen's television program, which gained fame when it once competed with Ed Sullivan's video show for ratings, was entitled "Life Is Worth Living." The good Bishop only recently retired as auxiliary bishop of New York
