## Respiratory Teaching Day

Hornell — Respiratory Teaching Day was held at St. James Mercy Hospital last week. Ninety-eight registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, nurses' aides, orderlies and public health nurses attended the day-long session which was held in DeSales Hall, the new educational center of the School of Nursing.

Sister Mary Camillus, supervisor of the emergency department of the local hospital, and coordinator of the program, welcomed the group and introduced the speakers who are members of the hospital staff.

Mr. Bondi, supervisor of the physical therapy department and rehabilitation center, demonstrated and explained the functioning of the Collins 9 Liter Spirometer. The unit is used to determine lung volume and capacity to provide pulmonary function diagnosis.

Mr. Bondi was assisted by a volunteer "patient" from the audience in demonstrating the spirometer.

"Medical Significance of Diagnostic Tests" was discussed by Dr. Mario Argentero. He said that the medical significance of pulmonary testing does not necessarily pinpoint the type of disease, but it is an aid in making a diagnosis. He went on to say that the testing can tell the physician just how severe and progressive a disease is. It is also an easily reproducible method to follow a patient's progress.

Dr. G. B. Ross, anesthesiologist, discussed "Pre-operative Preparation and General Anesthesia." He told of the need for pre-operative preparation and the importance of the study of a patient's history, physical examination and tests in making an assessment of the type of anesthetic required.

Dr. Ross told the nurses that they played an important role by their observation of a patient requiring pre-operative care. He went on to explain the problems of patients who have respiratory diseases when receiving anesthesia and why the choice of anesthetic is so important. He also explained the different types of anesthesia which are local, spinal, general, caudal and epidural.

"The Patient and Chest Surgery" was the subject of Dr. Byron Collins presentation. He discussed the different types of tests taken to determine the need for chest surgery and the methods used in describing the nursing care of patients he covered all major points and demonstrated equipment used in the care of the surgical patient.

Sister Camillus spoke on "Nursing Care of the Post-operative Patient" describing nursing measures used to relieve the patient's discomfort. She also discussed other therapeutic procedures. Sister said, "the nurse can do much to help alleviate the patient's fears."

Inhalation Therapy was explained by Michael Shannon, R.I.T. who said, "it is the art and science of treating respiratory disorders." He demonstrated the various types of equipment used and explained the medications and gases which are applied with various techniques. He said, "both pre-operative and post-operative patients receive inhalation therapy to help prevent respiratory complications."

At the conclusion of the session, Sister Camillus said, "it is gratifying to find so many nursing personnel and people in the paramedical field interested in learning more about respiratory diseases."

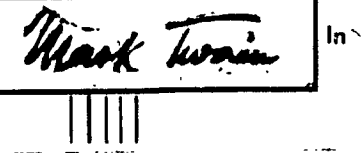
