Aquinas Institute Begins New Library Program

An expanding library program has been inaugurated at Aquinas Institute and will be available to students beginning Monday, Feb. 19, the opening of national Catholic Book Week.

Secondary school pupils may use the library facilities at the Dewey Avenue school each night from 7 to 9 p.m. as a study and research center or for borrowing books and other materials.

Materials to be available include recordings and a listening center where pupils can hear tapes or records without disturbing the quiet of the room. Also available are 8 mm single concept films, slides and filmstrips, which may be seen through individual viewers, as well as prints and charts.

According to Father Leon G. Hart, C.S.B., school principal, expanding the school library facilities is another step in the development of an independent study project being conducted

at Aquinas this year. The project aims to give each individual student the opportunity to develop his unique talents and interests to the highest possible degree.

Aquinas librarian Father John Whitley points out that the independent study concept requires specific instruction in such matters as how and where to study, the use of card catalogs, listening, viewing and reading habits and the use of audio-visual devices. The library's new evening hours will allow students to utilize a variety of personalized independent study needs under the guidance of professional personnel. The evening library hours for a school library is unique in the area.
