## Mooney Stews Irish 55-39

Cardinal Mooney's high flying Cardinals posted their twelfth victory in fourteen decisions last Friday night, as they bombed Aquinas, 55-39, at the Maiden Lane gym. The Mooney victory maintained the first place Catholic League desk lock between Mooney and McQuaid, while Aquinas' loss further cemented the Irish in their third place position.

Cardinal Mooney took an early lead which was only threatened once after the first quarter buzzer. Aquinas junior Jim Brady pulled the Irish within three at 20-17 midway through the second period, but Eddie Nietopski's senior duo of Otis Davis and Jim Harrington opened the margin to 31-19 by the half.

In the second half the tenacity of Mooney's defense, coupled with a careful Cardinal offense, continued to be too much for Aquinas and by the game's end it was a Mooney rout. Jim Harrington copped game high honors in two departments with 18 points and 23 rebounds. Teammates Otis Davis and Doug Farrell chipped in with 12 and 10 pieces, while Jim Brady led the Irish with 15.

In Saturday night action Cardinal Mooney won their thirteenth game of the season by means of a 59-34 rout of Fairport. Harrington and Farrell lead the scorers with 13 apiece.

Aquinas raised its record to 9-7 with a double overtime 65-60 victory over Lyons Central. Jim

### Notre Dame Tops Elmira

The Notre Dame Crusaders staged a second half rally and were able to topple a strong Elmira-Free Academy club, 78-52 on Tuesday, Feb. 7 in Notre Dame gymnasium.

The win was the reverse of an earlier game this season when Academy won handily at their own gym.

In the first half both teams played a steady game and entered intermission deadlocked 33-33. The second half saw the Crusaders use a full-court press which was effective in causing numerous turnovers at crucial times. Meanwhile N.D. started to click from the field, hitting for 45 points in the final two quarters.

The press and foul trouble underneath forced E.F.A. to change their normal style and enabled N.D. to win what for them is probably the biggest game of the year.

Bill Baker led N.D. scorers with 25 points while Dick Woodward had 19 for the Blue Devils.

Notre Dame now stands 10-4 on the season with both defeating the other once.

St. John Fisher's Cardinals won their basketball game of the season Saturday, downing Waterloo Lutheran University for the second time in less than a month, 79-61.

Billy O'Rourke and Doug Harper scored 18 points apiece in the contest, with O'Rourke dropping in 15 in the first half while Harper was collecting 12 in the same period. Jim Charles added 14 to the Fisher count.

The Cardinals were never headed after the first 10 minutes of play and enjoyed a comfortable 61-48 margin at half-time.

They continued to widen the margin in the early minutes of the second period, running the score to 71-42 with 9:55 left on the clock. At that point court press applied a tight full-court offense that halted the Fish-er offense, but the Cardinals' advantage was too great to overcome in spite of the Canadians' try.

## McQuaid Beats BK in Overtime

McQuaid's erratic Knights beat Bishop Kearney, 66-60, in overtime last Friday but were upset by Brighton, 61-53, the next night in their last two outings before tonight's big game at Cardinal Mooney. The Knights, now 10-6, are currently deadlocked with the Cards with a 4-1 record in league play, so the league championship rests on the outcome.

At Kearney, McQuaid was behind 41-37 after 3 periods but spurred into a 44-43 lead early in the fourth quarter. However, two Kearney clusters of 4 around John Koller's goal gave the Kings a 51-46 lead.

With 1:20 remaining, McQuaid's Brad Smith picked off a pass and went the full court for a layup and a 53-52 lead for the Knights. A foul by Combs and two by Kearney's DeVoldre tied the score, but Koller put in a layup on an assist from Bob Weingartner to

make it 56-54 with less than 30 seconds left. It was then that a foul at the buzzer provided the game's most dramatic moment, giving Kearney's Tom Mangione two shots with no time left on the clock. Mangione was equal to the pressure, sinking both cleanly to send the game into overtime.

McQuaid took control then and scored seven straight, 5- by Combs, to put the game on ice. Koller was the game's high scorer with 30, backed up by Combs' 19. Kearney was paced by Bruce Boss (18) and Mangione (14).

The next night, early in the second period, Brighton outscored the Knights, 12-2, to mount up a 28-16 lead that was never seriously threatened. Using a full-court press nearly the whole game, the Barons forced many McQuaid mistakes and never let the Knights score more than 4 points in a row.

Brighton put 4 men in double figures, led by Greg Novak's 16, all in the first half. Koller again led McQuaid, with 27, but he was the only Knight in the doubles.

The grapplers of Bishop Kearney High School clinched a Diocesan Championship as they trounced McQuaid, 28 to 15, Saturday. The Kings are undefeated against Catholic opponents this year.
