Miracle
In Baltimore

Baltimore — (RNS) — No one was killed when the roof of St. Rose of Lima church, Baltimore, came crashing down upon the congregation during an early morning Mass. The Rev. James C. Perry, pastor of the nearby Brooklyn Park Methodist church, said: "It was the miracle of the century in Baltimore that no one was killed." More than forty persons were injured, 31 of them children who were offering daily Mass and daily Communion for Lent. When the roof collapsed, it came to rest atop the church pews; forewarned by the roar of the breaking roof, the congregation dived beneath seats to escape death.

10 Year Term for Pastors

Clergy Propose Parish Renewal

Wilmington, Del. — (NC) — A sharing of parish responsibility by the pastor with other priests, the laity and nuns of the parish has been recommended by the Wilmington diocese clergy committee on renewal here. The recommendation was contained in a press release based on the Dec. 16 meeting of the committee.

The 16-member committee also suggested that the term "associate pastor" be used in referring to parish curates. This will "bring out more forcefully the cooperation that should exist between the pastor and his priests," the statement said.

Committee members also recommended that a pastor should serve a maximum of 10 years in each parish, and a maximum of five years as an associate pastor. The term for the pastor "would afford a new challenge to the priest, and give the parishes involved greater vitality as a result of new points of view and approaches to parish problems," the statement said.

The committee recommended further that seniority alone not be the criterion for selecting pastors, but that ability and past performance also be weighed.

Another recommendation was that a priest be permitted to retire at 65 from administrative responsibilities and be required to submit his resignation to the bishop at 70. The statement added, however, that the bishop would not have to accept the resignation.

The committee also said that the diocese should provide suitable pensions for retired priests. It asked that details of such a plan be taken up by the diocesan priests' senate to be organized once the present renewal committee finished making its recommendations.

Regarding a sharing of responsibility with the laity in the parish, the committee recommended that the "main responsibility for directing parish societies, social events, fund raising drives, etc., rests on the laity."

"Indirect supervision is all that ordinarily need be done by the pastor and the associate pastors of the parish," the statement said.

It was also suggested that each parish should have sufficient lay staff—paid or voluntary—to meet the janitorial, secretarial, collection-cumming, recording and housekeeping needs of the parish. The committee stated that this would free the priests from "non-priestly work," inasmuch as the function of the priest is described as "proclaiming the word of God and ministering to the needs of the people."

To aid the priest to "be among the people," the committee suggested the "reasonable" use of modern communication devices, such as telephones, answering services which "free the priest from being unnecessarily confined to the rectory."

Other recommendations mentioned in the press statement were the following:

- The pastor should provide leadership and guidance to the parish so that all will work together for the common good.
- The pastor and his associates should keep each other "honestly informed" about the state of the parish.
- The associates should have the "necessary authority" to fulfill the parish responsibilities which cover them by the pastor.
- Consultation with the pastor and other priests of the parish by the bishop should take place before a parishioner is appointed to a diocesan level organization.
- Relatives of a priest should not work or live in the rectory.
- Every priest should be free to entertain guests in the rectory, with due consideration to his other residents.

N.Y. Airport Chapel Cited for Design

New York — (RNS) — The Tri-Faith Chapel at Kennedy International Airport, where Protestant, Catholic and Jewish chapels are located, received a special Bronze Plaque Award from the Queens Chamber of Commerce for "excellence in design and civic value."

In addition, the three chapels were among 16 other recipients of bronze plaques for "outstanding conceptual contribution to the borough of Queens" presented by the C of C in its 1966 annual building awards program.

Other award winners included First Methodist church in Jamaica for its new education building, and St. Gregory's Catholic rectory in Bellerose for its auditorium.

The three plaza chapels are on a three-acre site opposite the airport's International Arrivals Building, and overlook a 655-foot lagoon. They serve thousands of airport personnel and millions of passengers passing through annually.
