Art Tour For Students

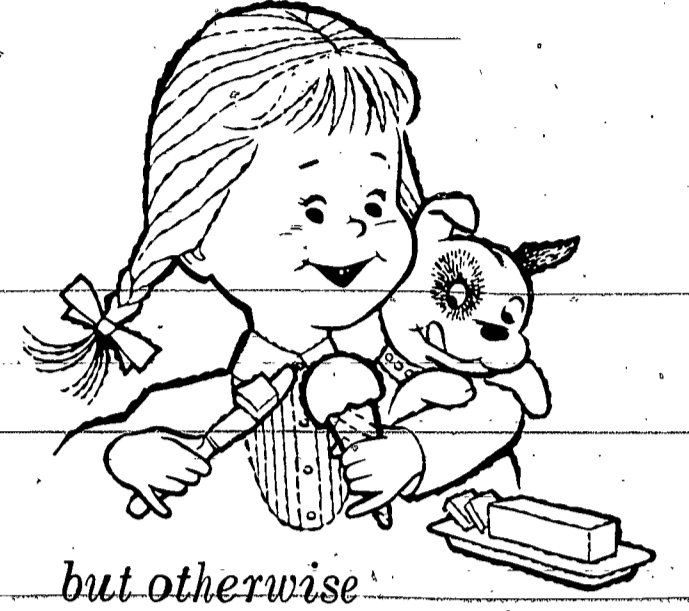

"POP" CHIPPED BEEF POT PIE
1 cup chopped onions
1 package dried Russer's beef (cut up)
1/4 cup hot margarine (Blue Bonnet)
2 tbs. flour
1 tsp. salt
2 cups water
1/4 tsp. pepper
2 cups thinly sliced carrots
2 cups thinly sliced potatoes
1 or 2 bouillon cubes
Sauté onions and beef in hot margarine. Stir in flour, seasonings. Add rest of ingredients and bring to a boil. Cover and simmer for five minutes. Pour mixture into 2 quart casserole and top with pastry.
Bake 25-30 minutes at 425 degrees.
Pastry Topping
1 cup sifted flour
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup shortening
2 tbs. water
Roll out as you would for pie dough. Cut several small slits to allow steam to escape.

Vatican Paper on Davis: 'Sad, Yes, but Logical'

Vatican City—(NC)—Commenting on the recent decision by English theologian Father Charles Davis to leave the Church, the Vatican City daily L'Osservatore Romano has asked all Catholics to pray that the Holy Spirit "reanimate in each of us... that faith for which neither rational commitment, culture nor study can substitute."
The editorial by Associate Editor Federico Alessandrini (Feb. 4) called Father Davis' action "an apostasy which is apparently an act of moral and intellectual honesty—sad, yes, but logical."
Without faith, the editorialist said, "no matter what our intention or our good will may be, we cannot serve Christ in men; the Son of Man would no longer be God but a mere sage like many who have inscribed their names in the history of philosophy and sometimes of Utopia, by seeking uselessly outside themselves for that which can be found only within us."
Alessandrini said that the paper had not commented before on Father Davis' announcement, made Dec. 2 in London, because it wanted to wait for more solid information than the news agencies could provide. "It is a matter not of entering full force into the secret of a conscience, of listening to them with respect of meditating on the words spoken," he said.

Author, Teacher To Lecture

The fourth lecture in a series of six Lenten Lectures will be held at St. Michael Parish Library, 877 Clinton Ave. North, Rochester, Friday, March 3, at 8:15 p.m., and will be given by Miss Blanche Jennings Thompson. Her topic will be "Random Thoughts of a Layman."
Miss Thompson is a local author and former teacher who has written more than thirty books, chiefly in the juvenile and textbook field. Among them are "With Harp and Lute," an anthology of religious poetry, six Vision Books on the lives of the saints, and a prayer book, "All Day with God" first published in 1939 and revised last year to conform to the new liturgy. Her well known anthologies, "Silver Pennies" and "More Silver Pennies" will be published this year in one volume to be called "All the Silver Pennies."
