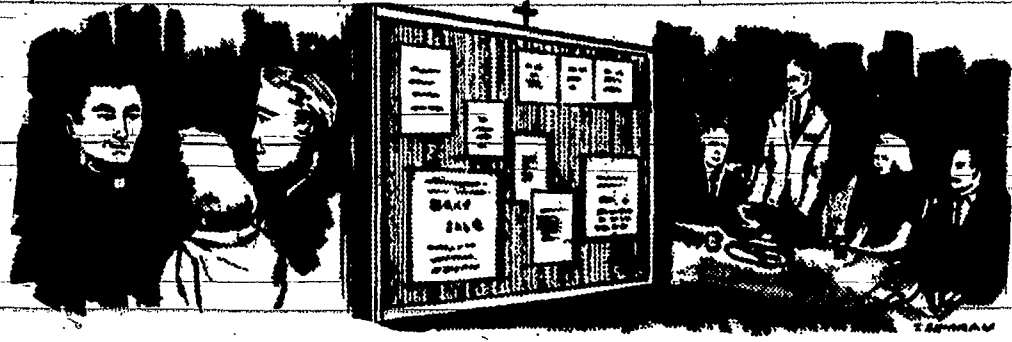




Mothers Plan Fashion Show

Priests' Library Planned at Cathedral

First contribution to a new Parish Priests' Library was made by the Catholic War Veterans — Sacred Heart Post No. 1127, the Sacred Heart Cathedral bulletin announced Sunday.

The plan to establish a permanent, parish-owned reference library for the priests in a suitable room in the rectory was announced by Father John S. Hayes, rector in the previous week's bulletin.

It is planned to stock the new library with books of technical interest to the priests "whose preaching, teaching, confessing and counselling will reflect their reading."

"Vatican Council II has updated much of our personal libraries and new works on Liturgy, Scripture and Moral Theology are in great demand; a very expensive matter. We want our priests to have the best," the appeal continued.

"Our library will be composed of books selected from lists provided by Seminary professors expert in their fields, and suggested by reviews that point to useful volumes on theology.

"Rather than have a special collection I am asking families who can afford it to contribute \$50 or \$25 to this purpose. Possibly groups of families could join together in a contribution that would reflect their interest in this study.

"We intend too to make these volumes available to parishioners who have special interest in theological study."

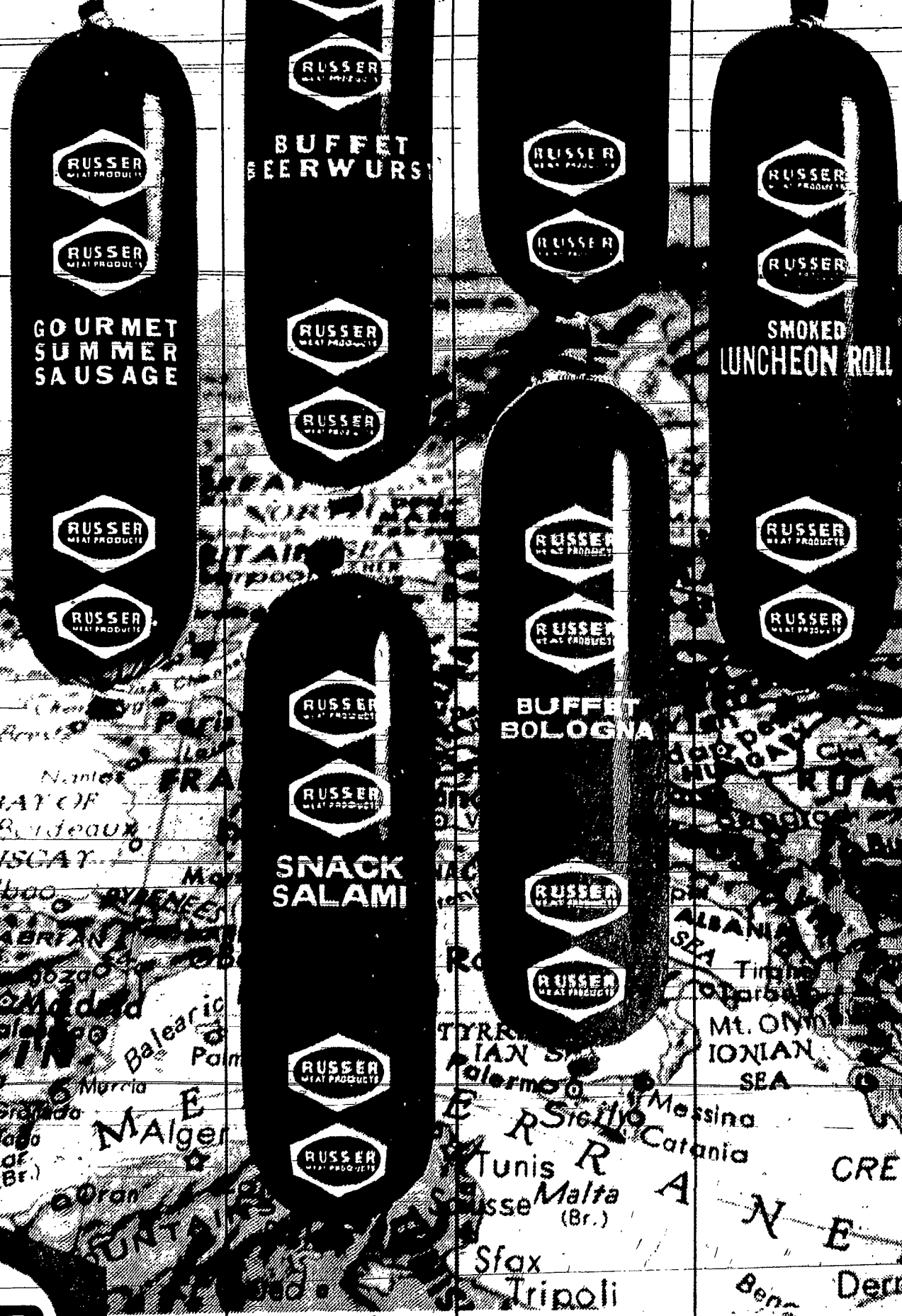

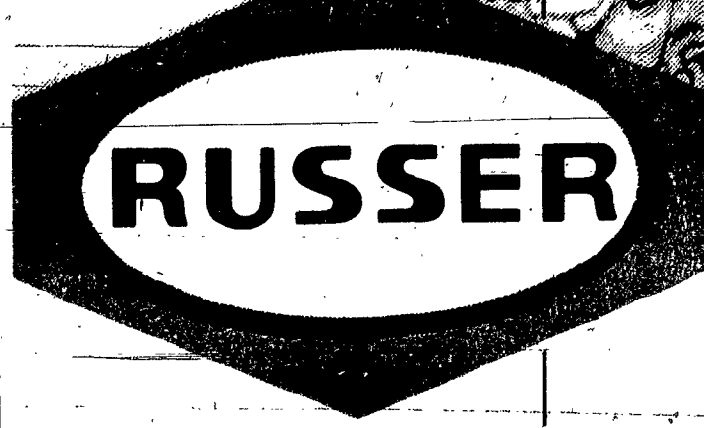

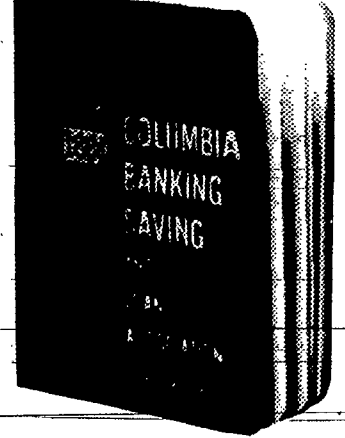
