Aquinas Keglers Take Lead In Bowling Loop

Diek Nugent of McQuaid rolled a 237 game to highlight action in the Catholic Inter-scholastic Bowling League at midseason but Aquinas-Nick-Schwaly with a 639 series helped keep the Irish in first place.

In the A League, Aquinas sports a 23 won, 5 loss record for a 910 average and maintains a secure hold on the top spot. Runner-up McQuaid with a 15-13 record shows an overall average of 836. Bishop Kearney, 14-14, is in third place followed by

6-12 Mooney. Aquinas captured four of the top five spots, paced by Nick Schwaly's 193.8 average. Jim Dettman averaged 187.1 in 21 games while teammate Tom Brongo hit 183.1 and Bob Fanone 178.6.

In B League competition Aquinas emerged victorious with 22 wins against 6 losses for an 800 average. Close behind and threatening is Bishop Kearney High with an 18-10 record. Mooney is 14-14 in third place followed by 3-25 McQuaid.

Mooney Takes Catholic Crown

Cardinal Mooney High School won its first Catholic high school basketball title at home before 1,100 spectators as it beat McQuaid 59-44. It marked the 14th win in 16 games for the Cardinals. Again, it was the pressing defense for which the Cardinals are noted that made the difference as McQuaid was forced to turn the ball over numerous times.

Mooney opened up with a 19-7 bulge in the first period of play and led 26-18 at halftime.

The Knights closed the gap in the third period 33-30 as John Koller began to open up. A last quarters spurt by Davis and Harrington pulled the Cardinals ahead and gave them the city championship.

Davis led Mooney with 23 points while Harrington had 15 and Farrell 10. Koller had 23 points and Nick Combs had 13 for McQuaid. Harrington also led the rebound department by pulling down 18 rebounds.

On Saturday, Mooney traveled to Rush-Henrietta where they met the Comets, current leaders of the county league. Bill Smith had his own way as he dominated both boards and scored 30 points. The final score was 70-44 in favor of Rush. Harrington was high for Mooney with 13 points.

Also on Saturday, McQuaid's John Koller broke the school career scoring record while leading the Knights to a 64-52 win over Fairport. Koller's total of 460 points broke Tony Leonardo's record of 454.

Fisher Wins Two Games

Two victories in as many games on last weekend's Canadian road trip boosted St. John Fisher's basketball record to five wins against nine losses, with five games remaining on the schedule.

The Cardinals outlasted McMaster University at Hamilton, Ont., Friday to win by a 63-56 score. Bill O'Rourke dunked 20 points on eight field goals and four foul shots to pace the winners. Close behind for Fisher was Tony Binsack with 16 points.

With the same duo leading the way on Saturday, Fisher easily triumphed over traditional rival St. Michael's of Toronto, 75-61. O'Rourke, a sophomore, again topped the Cardinals in scoring with 22 points to maintain his varsity average of 20 points per game. Binsack netted 11 points against St. Mike's.

The Cardinals play two games at home this weekend, facing Ontario State tonight and a return match with St. Michael's tomorrow afternoon in the Fisher Athletic Center. Fisher's one-beaten freshman five will open tonight's twin bill at 6:15 p.m.

'Keep The Lights On' Petition Circulating

A local citizens group is currently circulating a petition in an effort "to keep the lights on" in the Rochester Lighted School House Program.

The petition which has been organized by Councilman Stephen May and by J. Lloyd Lill, a professor of Economics at St. John Fisher College, urges the Rochester City Council, the Rochester School District, the County of Monroe local industries and organizations to pool their resources on behalf of the program. The students at St. John Fisher College and the public and private high schools throughout the county are circulating the petitions.

For the first time in the tournament, first and second rated area teams will play in their local areas while third and fourth rated teams will travel.

Cardinal Mooney, winner of the Rochester Catholic League Championship as the result of its win over McQuaid last Friday, will be favored to add the Diocesan High School crown to its trophy room. Mooney will meet St. Anthony of Padua (Watkins Glen) Sunday, March 5 at 2:30 p.m. in the RIT Gymnasium. Mooney's overall record is 14-3. Padua's is 7-8.

McQuaid, 11-7, runner-up in the Rochester Catholic League plays Mt. Carmel, Auburn (5-9) on Friday, March 3, at 7:30 match.

The number one Southern Tier threat in the tournament, Notre Dame from Elmira, will meet Bishop Kearney on Saturday, March 4 at 7:30 p.m. in the Notre Dame Gym. Notre Dame has a strong 10-3 record while a scrappy Kearney team (2-14) will be looking for an upset win.

The number two rated team from outside Rochester, De Sales of Geneva, will meet Aquinas on Sunday, March 5 at 2:30 p.m. in the Hobart College Auditorium. This game will be rated a toss-up with Aquinas holding a 10-7 season record and De Sales an 8-4.

The winner of the Mooney-Padua contest is scheduled to play the survivor of the Aquinas-DeSales game. The second semi-final game pits the winner of the McQuaid-Mt. Carmel game against the winner of the Kearney-Notre Dame match.
