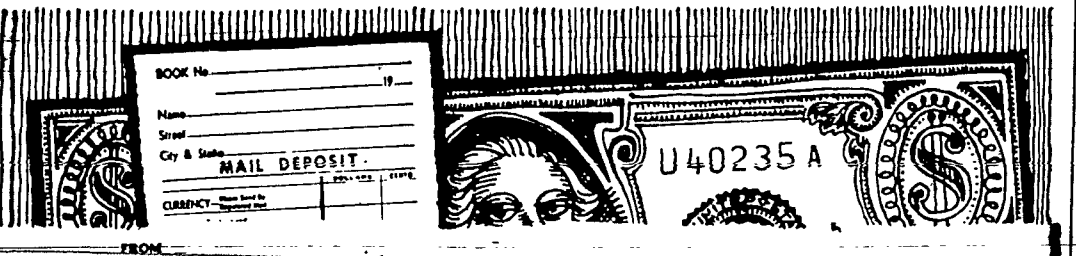


New Scout Troop in Corning
