At St. Luke's**

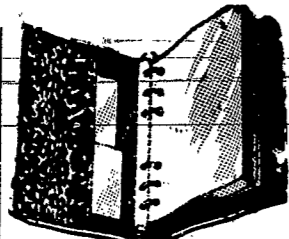

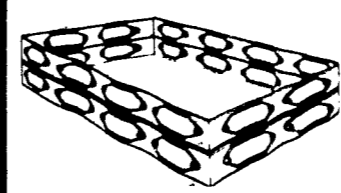
