

### Gordon Farrell, Ex-Niagara PR

Funeral services were held Thursday, March 2, in St. Bernard's Church, Youngstown, N.Y., for J. Gordon "Red" Farrell, 57, of 146 Chestnut Street, Youngstown, who died Feb. 27, 1967 in Mount St. Mary's Hospital after a long illness.

A native of Rochester, he was graduated from Aquinas Institute, was a 1932 graduate of Niagara University where he played under-graduate baseball winning his letter as a pitcher.

After graduation he joined the university's public relations staff and was director of the department from 1932 to 1952 when he entered military service.

Mr. Farrell was one of the first fulltime college public relations directors in upstate New York. He also taught English briefly at Niagara University.

Mr. Farrell joined the editorial staff of the Niagara Falls Gazette in 1947 and after serving as general assignment reporter and other capacities, he became police reporter, a job he handled for years. He left the paper in October 1963.

During World War II he served from June 1943 to August 1945 in England and was editor of the Army newspaper "The White Falcon." He was discharged as staff sergeant in October 1945.

Mr. Farrell was a member of St. Bernard's Church, Youngstown and the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

He is survived by his wife Hannah of Youngstown, his parents Mr. and Mrs. George Farrell, a brother Maurice, a sister, Mrs. F. Edward (Oonah) Devine, two nephews Michael E. and Gordon J. Devine all of Rochester, and a niece Mrs. Basil J. Michel of Pittsford, also a grand nephew.

Interment was in St. Bernard's Cemetery.

A dessert card party for the benefit of Jesuit Father Michael F. Kavanagh will be held in St. Augustine school hall Friday, March 17, at 1:00 p.m.

Father Kavanagh, a Jesuit missionary, recently returned to India after a six month stay in the U.S. He had worked among the poor and the lepers for 11 years prior to his homecoming.

Father Kavanagh, in a recent letter, said: "The job with the leprosy patients is enormous. Multiply, ten times, all that I have said and you have it. They are flocking in and all hungry. New cases are turning up almost daily. Last clinic day there were thirteen. The doctor is marvelous — he and his crew have done truly excellent work."

Yet the doctor, in a realistic mood, shocked us when he said that the greater majority are not getting cured. We cure them and they immediately drop back, because we cannot control them and some take only half the medicine, most are so undernourished that they have no chance to rest and build up. They must work every day — that is chug, chug every day — begging."
