Notre Dame of Elmira used an overpower offense and a tenacious defense to outdistance Bishop Kearney, 79-54, in the opening round of the Rochester Diocesan Basketball Tournament.

Although the Fighting Irish led by only 25-22 at halftime, the game was turned into a Notre Dame romp during the early stages of the third quarter. The Elmira crew scored 19 consecutive points in the first six minutes of the third stanza while Kearney was in the process of scoring none.

Game-high scoring honors went to Notre Dame's Dan McCarthy as he spun 24 through the steel circle. Teammate Bill Russell contributed 17. Dan Howland paced Kearney with 16 points, followed by Bruce Boss and Steve Shales who had ten apiece.

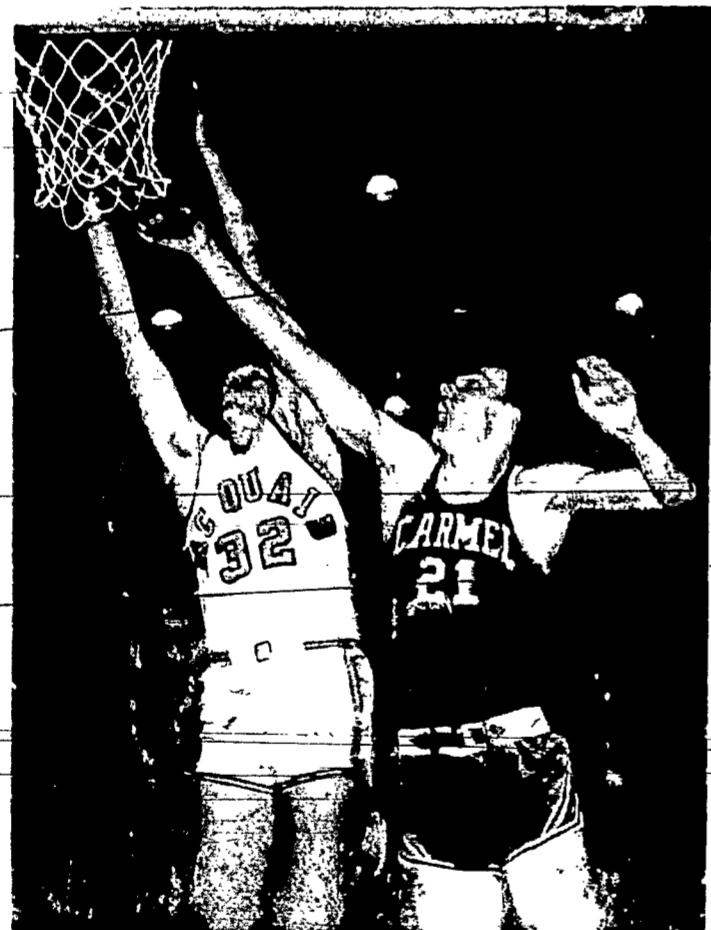

St. John Fisher cagers completed their schedule over the weekend by splitting a pair of home games to finish the season with a record of eight wins and twelve losses.

The Cards smothered Fredonia State on Friday, 76-56, after taking an early lead and maintaining it throughout the contest. Billy O'Rourke claimed game scoring honors with 24 points. The score was 40-27 in favor of the Indians at halftime, but the scrappy Fisher five outscored their rivals in the second half and with 1:58 remaining on the clock were down by only five points, 58-53.

### Fisher Frosh Slow Down Calvin & Co.

Six thousand basketball fans who paid their way into the War Memorial for Saturday's benefit contest pitting Calvin Murphy and the Niagara University frosh against St. John Fisher's baby Cardinals went away convinced that Calvin was just about as good as advertised but also with a great deal of respect for the Fisher squad who gave no quarter in standing up to their subsidized opponents from the big time raps. The final score was 93-79 in favor of the Purple Eagles.

The Cardinals kept within range of the taller, stronger Niagara five early in the first

half. With seven minutes of time elapsed they were down by only one point, 14-13. At the half it was Niagara 43, Fisher 31.

Coming on strong as the second half got started, St. John Fisher closed the gap to 54-48, with Bill O'Rourke, Dick Hiesinger and Bob Case finding the hoop.

At that point Murphy took matters into his own hands, putting on a dazzling exhibition of floor play and shooting that kept the ball swishing through the Niagara hoop from diverse angles and distances. By the

time he fouled out in the final minute of play, he had topped his personal contribution to the Niagara cause to 45 points, four below his average.

In confining the Purple Eagles team aggregate to 93 points, Bobby Wanzer's youngsters held the visitors to their second lowest score in 17 games, 12 points below their average for the year.

Hiesinger's 23 points and O'Rourke's 22 topped the scoring for St. John Fisher. Case had 13, and Pat Shatzel added 11. The loss was only the second in a 16-game slate for the fledgling Cardinals.

## B-Ball Teams Set For Diocesan Play Tonight

The Rochester Diocesan High School Basketball Tournament is shaping up to be one of the most hotly contested in the nine-year history of the tournament. After the quarter-final elimination games the four teams remaining are the number one and number two ranked teams from the Rochester area, Cardinal Mooney, and McQuaid, and the one and two ranked teams from outside Rochester in Notre Dame of Elmira and De Sales of Geneva. This is scheduled to change tonight (Friday) when Cardinal Mooney takes on De Sales in the McQuaid Gym at 7:30 p.m. and McQuaid plays Notre Dame of Elmira in the St. John Fisher College gym at 7:30 p.m.

Cardinal Mooney has been the favorite to add the Diocesan trophy to its Rochester Catholic High Championship. It will be hoping for another outstanding performance from Otis Davis who paced the Cardinals over a stubborn St. Anthony of Padua five in the quarter-finals.

Its opponent De Sales makes up for its short stature with excellent outside shooting. It will be relying upon another sterling performance from co-captain, Steve Fitzgerald leading scorer with 17 points a game. In De Sales quarter final double overtime win over Aquinas, Fitzgerald and Bill Dinan each scored 17 apiece.

Notre Dame of Elmira will be bringing in an outstanding 15-4 record in their encounter with McQuaid. Notre Dame has an aggressive offense scoring over 100 points in their last two season games.
