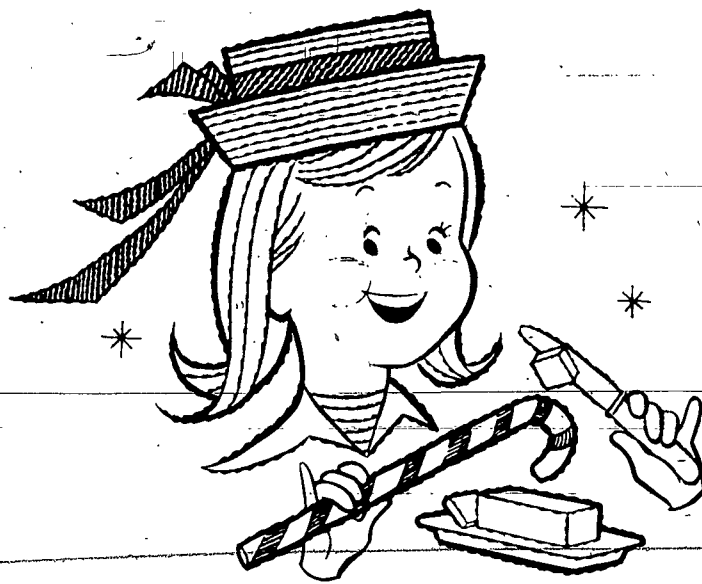
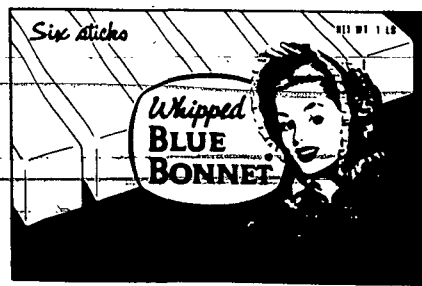

Book Readied For Youngsters On Molesters

The Rochester JayCees, junior Chamber of Commerce group, is currently preparing a 20-page book to warn youngsters of kindergarten through third grade about child molesters.

Thomas E. Keller, project chairman, seeks \$3,800 in a March through June fund drive to meet cost of publishing 50,000 copies of the book which he hopes to distribute before school vacations begin in June.

The book, he said, seeks through cartoons and verses to warn, but not alarm, children about "being friendly with strangers and how to cope with possibly dangerous situations."

Father Daniel Brent of the Catholic Schools office and other civic and school officials have recommended publication of the book, Keller said.

Mrs. Francis Iaia, grand regent, presided at the business session. She discussed the coming events of the Cayuga Dean-

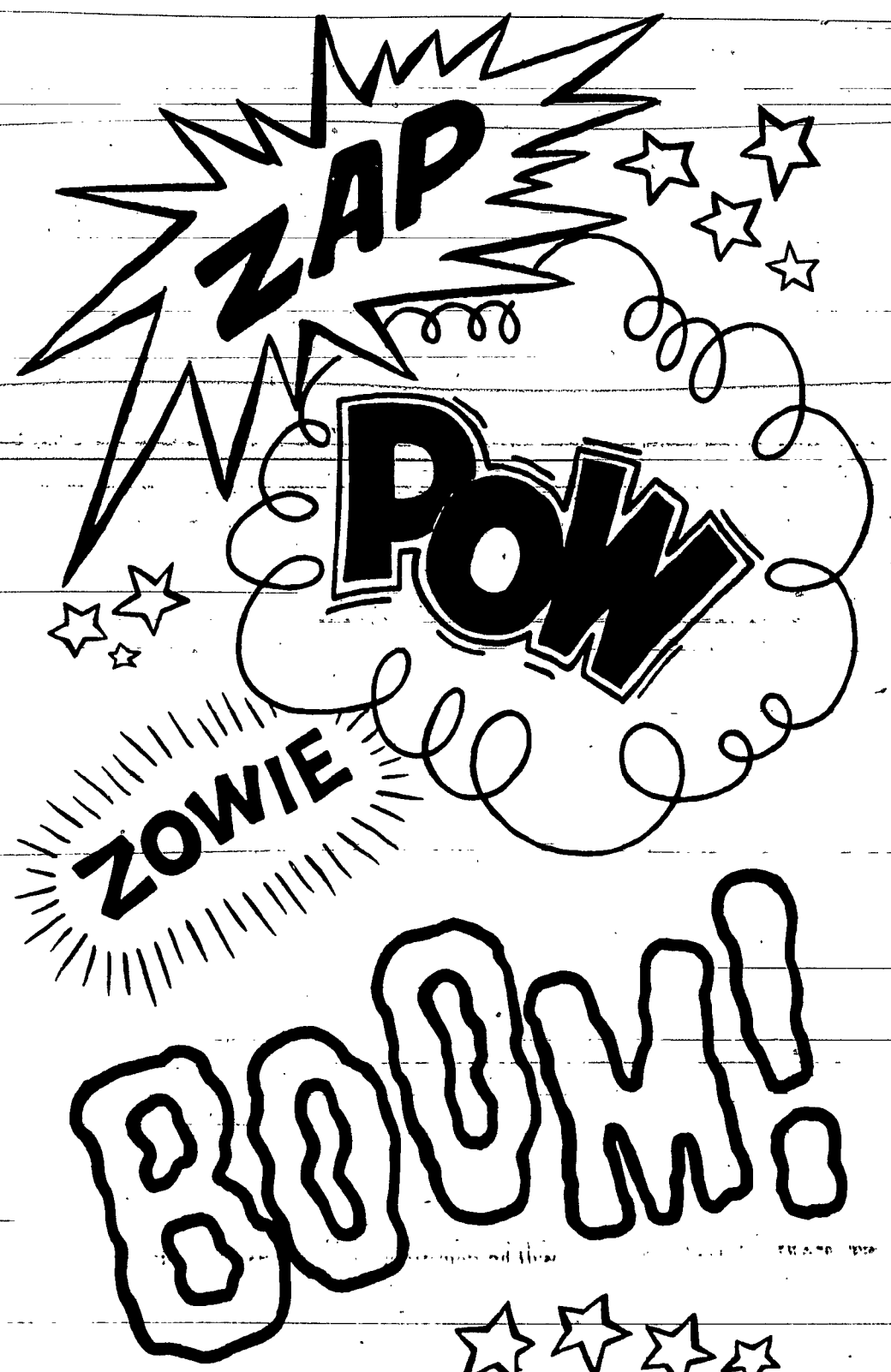

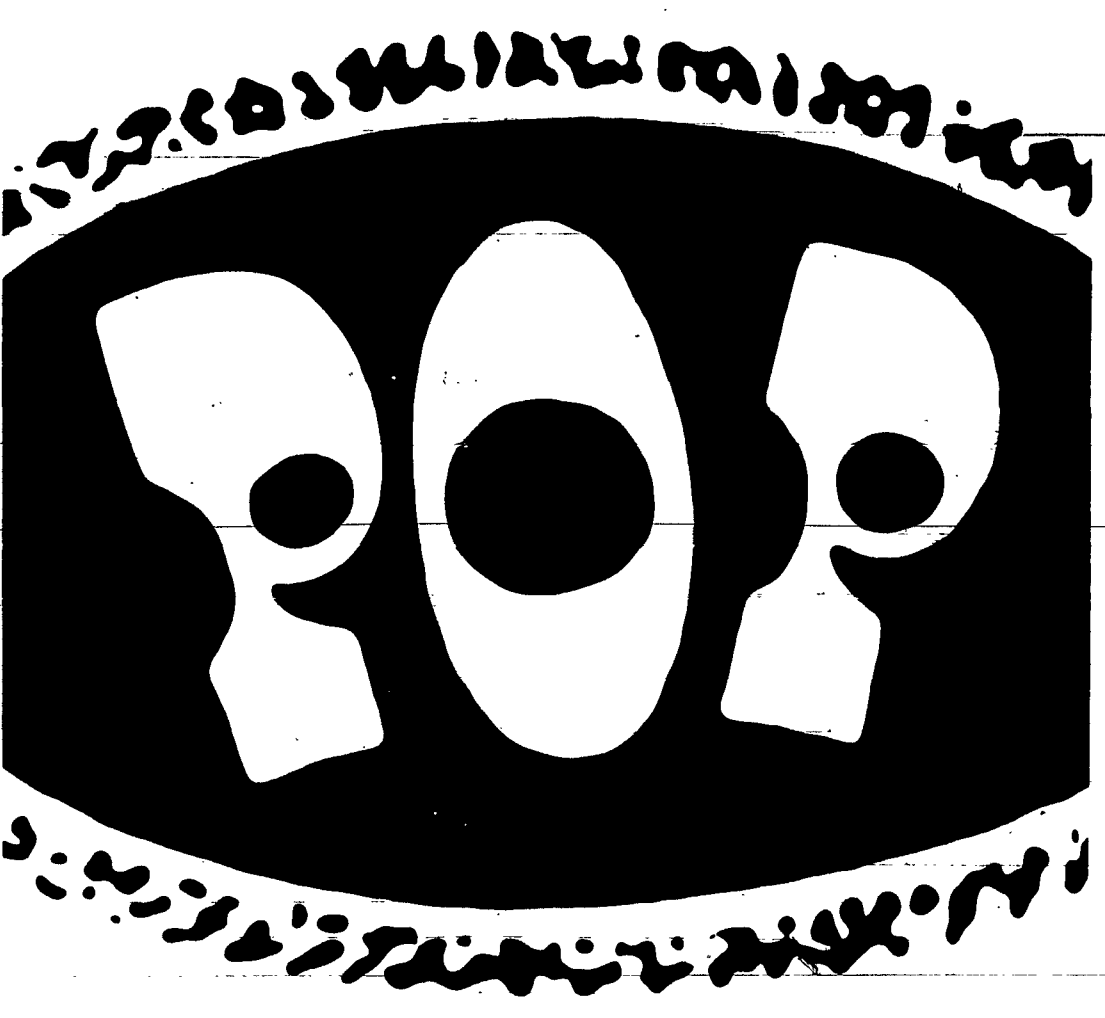
Catholic Faith On Razor's Edge

Cardiff, South Wales—(RNS)—The "false prophets" of ecumenism came under fire from Roman Catholic Archbishop John A. Murphy of Cardiff. In a pastoral letter, he declared that Catholics are balancing truth on a "razor's edge."

Major theme of the pastoral was ecumenism with all its hopes and also the perils for those who operated a false ecumenism in defiance of the spirit of the Holy Ghost and the Vatican Council.

"There will always be in every movement," he said, "the false prophets who want to clean up the problems by sweeping it out of sight; who seek the slick solution, the quick anodyne, the ready aspirin. Remove the pain and forget the cause. Solve the mixed marriage problem, admit the validity of Anglican Orders, allow joint churches, pulpits, divorce and the pill, and all will be well."

"All won't be well," he added. "We have removed the very troubles which drive men to seek unity."
