The proceeds from the twelve bout card are destined to help support domestic and foreign missionary activities.

The heavyweight class saw junior John (Bomber) Byrnes and sophomore Dick Anderson windmill-blow after blow in reciprocation while the audience beamed forth with unanimous and standing ovation approval. At the end of the wild three rounds, Byrnes was declared the winner and new heavyweight champion.

The fight was voted the evening's most outstanding, and Byrnes and Anderson were therefore the recipients of the Abe Raff trophies.

The evening's outstanding fighter was Jim Cronmiller, a 139 pound junior, who defeated senior Frank Giancola. Cronmiller, the recipient of the

Referees were Abe Raff, Sam Cappa and John Mastrella. Carman Basilio, former world welterweight champion, was guest



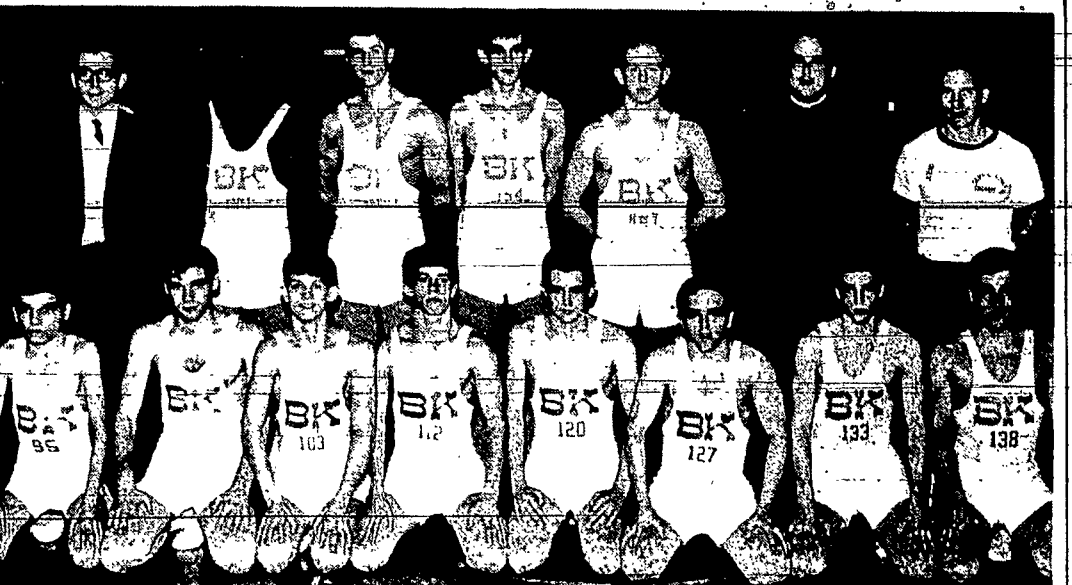
