

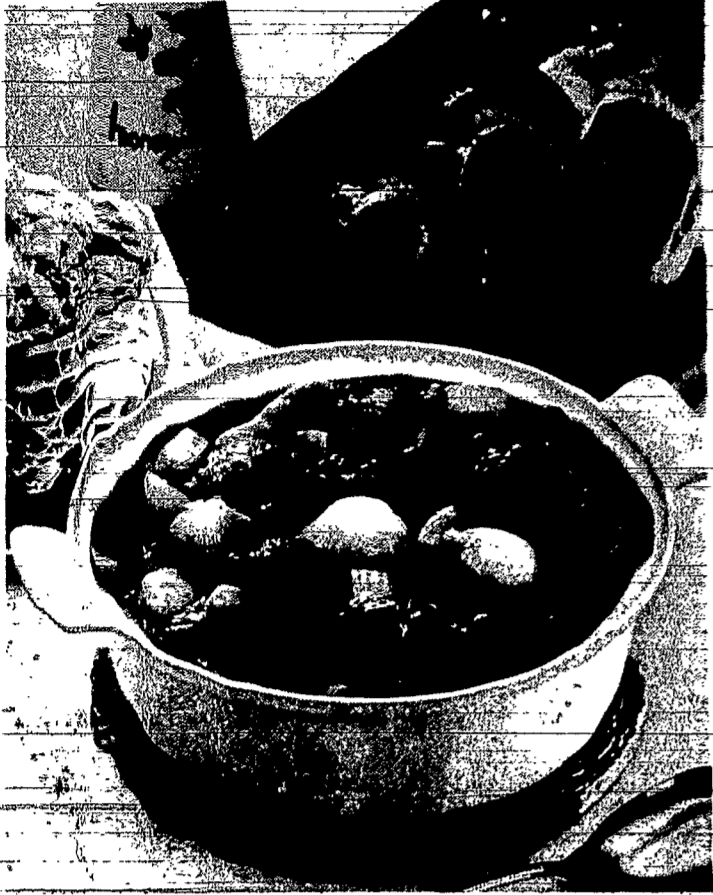
Golden Jubilee For Baiers

A little ground beef goes a long way in this new POP recipe—half way around the world, in fact, for an exotic flavor born of spices, herbs, Parmesan cheese, and canned Hunt's Tomato Paste. Carrots, onions, and celery are added the last half hour of cooking.

- STEW LA ROMA**
- 1 lb. ground beef
 - 1/2 cup fine bread crumbs
 - 1 egg
 - 1 t. salt
 - 1/2 t. pepper
 - 1/4 t. nutmeg
 - 1/4 t. thyme
 - 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
 - 2 T. pure vegetable oil
 - 2 (8-oz.) cans Hunt's Tomato Paste
 - 2 1/2 cups water
 - 1 1/2 t. salt
 - 1/2 t. sugar
 - 1 bay leaf
 - 1/4 t. marjoram
 - 4 carrots, pared and halved
 - 8 small whole onions
 - 3/4 cup coarsely chopped celery

Combine ground beef, bread crumbs, egg, salt, pepper, nutmeg, and thyme. Form into 1-inch meat balls; coat meat balls with Parmesan cheese. Brown well in pure vegetable oil. Combine tomato paste, water and seasonings; add to meat balls. Cover and simmer 30 minutes. Add carrots, onions, and celery. Simmer, covered, 30 minutes longer. Makes 4 servings.
