Aquinas Guard Wins International Honor

The New York State champion Aquinas Institute Color Guard went international last weekend and "came back to Rochester with everything but the kitchen sink."

In a contest sponsored by the Toronto Optimist Club last Saturday in the Canadian city, the Aquinas Color Guard took first place honors. In addition to a \$50 prize the boys were presented with a huge silver bowl, known as the International Cup. Michael Christian of Sacred Heart Cathedral parish and Aquinas Guard captain walked off with the best commander award. The guard also received a Canadian Centennial flag.

The 17-man Aquinas precision drill squad is currently New York State champions and will defend its title this summer in Buffalo at the American Legion contest and later in the summer at the State Exposition in Syracuse. In August the guard will compete for national honors in Boston.

The Canadian victory is the fourth time the Aquinas Guard has won first place this season and its twenty-fourth over the past three years.
