Pre-Cana Series Set For Elmira-Corning Area

The Elmira office of the Diocesan Family Life Bureau will hold a series of four Pre-Cana Conferences starting on Sunday, April 9, on Wednesday, April 12; Sunday, April 16 and Wednesday, April 19.

The series will be conducted at Our Lady of Lourdes Church Hall in Elmira. Each session will start at 8 p.m. The registration fee will be \$1 per couple.

All Corning-Elmira area couples planning marriage before the Fall are urged to attend.

In the course of the conferences Father Roy Higgins, Dr. Francis Haber and a panel of married couples will explore the religious, moral, social and economic dimensions of Christian marriage.

Each week's program will include refreshments and the opportunity to ask questions and discuss points with the speakers.

Ecumenical Tour Set

Two clergymen of the Rochester area will conduct an ecumenical Christian Ecumenical tour this June to the Holy Land, Rome, Cairo and Geneva, Switzerland.

Rev. David J. Call, pastor of St. Mary's in the Holy Land, and Father Edward B. Zenkel, curate at Guardian Angels Church, Henrietta, will be the chaplains of the tour group.

The 21-day trip is scheduled June 2 to 23 and has been arranged by the "Ask Mr. Foster Travel Service" of New York City and the "Group Travel Service" of Rochester.

The itinerary includes Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Israel — with visits to sites made famous in biblical history from Abraham to the Apostles. The tour group will also visit Switzerland and see first-hand places that figure prominently in the early history of the Protestant Reformation and also Rome and the Vatican. Arrangements are underway for an audience with Pope Paul.

The tour is the first ecumenical event of its kind to originate in Rochester. Both clergymen are well known locally for their ecumenical activities. Information and reservations may be made with them or the Group Travel Service.
