Redemptorist Fathers offered the funeral Mass for Rudolph C. Schwenger in St. Joseph's Church, March 31. Mr. Schwenger, 67, of 196 Thorncliffe Dr., Irondequoit, for many years, usher, server and trustee of St. Joseph's Church, died March 27, 1967.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father James Keane, C.S.S.R. with Fathers John Clerkin, C.S.S.R., St. Joseph's rector and Father Leo Dunn, C.S.S.R.

Knights, Masons For Patriotism

Johnson City, N.Y. — (RNS) — John W. McDevitt, supreme knight of the Knights of Columbus, called on members of his organization and the Masons to mount a vigorous campaign to rehabilitate the virtue of patriotism and the principles of good citizenship in the United States.

McDevitt, speaking at a brotherhood dinner here sponsored by local Knights and Masons, called the recent joint statement issued by top officials of both organizations "a magna charta of fraternal cooperation."

"We are passing through a dark episode in American history," Mr. McDevitt said, "when certain elements of the community glorify the draft card burner and the conniver who gives courses in deceit and subterfuge to help youths dodge the draft."

"Certainly our democratic nation need not force the conscience of an individual who abhors arms and would rather

bear a stretcher than a gun," he said. "Our nation must protect the rights of those who disagree with the will of the majority and it must provide for open discussion of public policy. But our nation cannot permit sabotage of the will of the majority and it cannot survive without a general spirit of patriotism."

"If love of country is superseded by love of self, if sacrifice for our nation is spurned for pursuit of personal pleasure, if the general interest is permitted to be frustrated by the folly of a few, then our democracy is in danger. Our freedoms are in danger. We are in danger. For then we can drift only into the suicidal extremes of anarchy or despotism," the K of C top official said.

McDevitt urged both organizations "individually and jointly to provide example, inspiration, and education which will raise the vital virtue of patriotism from the slump to which it has fallen in our day."

McDevitt also urged both organizations to encourage the proper respect for constituted authority and support for law and order.

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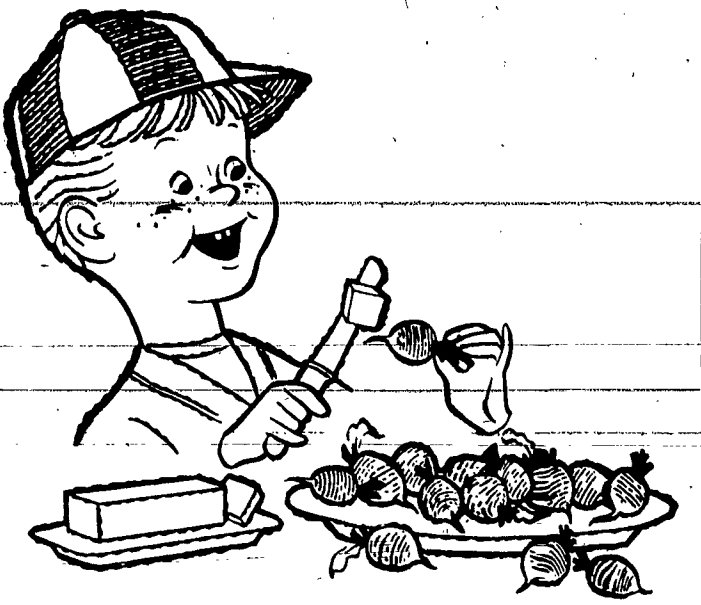


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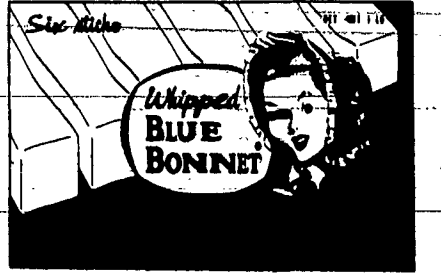
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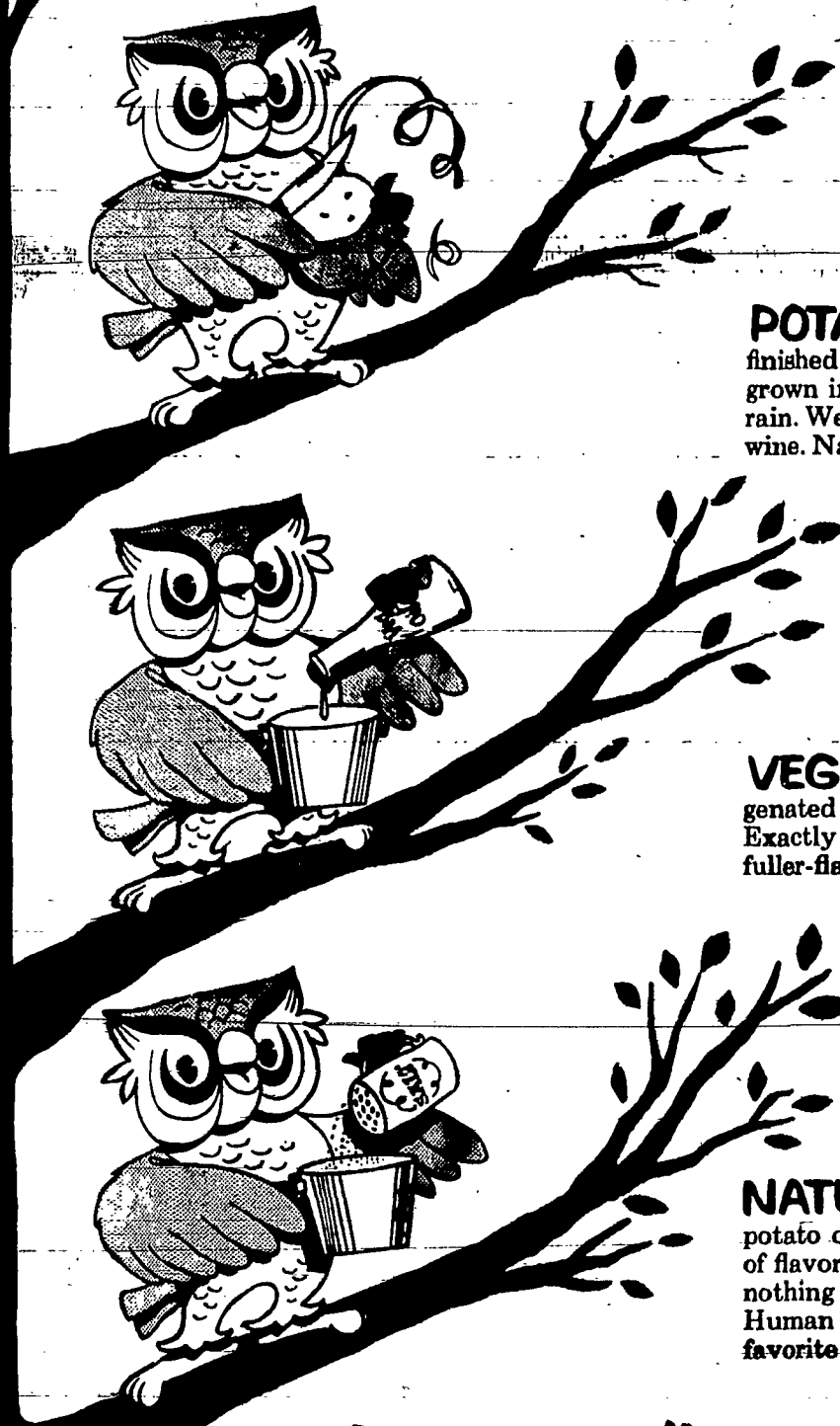
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
