Nicholas Teta To Leave ND

Nicholas Teta, for the past five years football coach and athletic director at Notre Dame High School in Elmira, has accepted a position as guidance counselor and football coach at Hornell High School for the coming school year.

Announcement of the hiring of Teta was made in Hornell last week by School Superintendent William Hin.

Joining the Notre Dame staff in 1962, Teta led his five Crusader teams to a combined 29-9-1 record. He was 5-2 in 1962, 7-1 in '63, 4-4 in '64, 7-0 in '65, and 6-2 in 1966.

Some of the individual gridiron stars developed during his

years at Notre Dame were Mike Johnston and Bill Knott, now Alfred's talented passing combination; Jim Ramich, who starred at Union, and his brother Joel, player of the year in area high school football last season; Mike Malone, now at Notre Dame University; Jack Leonard, now at Holy Cross College; and Ron Lironce III.

Teta himself is a former football star, having made Little All-America twice, in 1955 and 1956, while a guard at Alfred. He received his master's degree in education at Alfred, and taught for two years at Candor Central School before coming to Elmira.

He was named Coach of the Year last year at the Elmira Baseball Centennial All-Sports Banquet.

At Hornell, he will be replacing Lorry Castiglione, who is retiring after 20 years as Football coach.

"Naturally, I have some misgivings about leaving Notre Dame," Teta said. "Both the administration and the athletic association have treated me wonderfully."
