Marriage Article 'Disapproved'

Rensselaer — (NC) — The Vatican's doctrinal Congregation has "disapproved" the opinions of three Dutch theologians as expressed in an article on non-ecclasi-

might presume into areas where the institutional Church would find it necessary to remind them to rethink their position.

The Homiletic and Pastoral Review, he pointed out, is "not...review-conservative nor liberal" and accepts an article presenting a "well expressed opinion."

The authors of the article wrote that "a rather wide variety of human situations and ways-of-life" can be classified under the word "non-biblical" and questioned the pastoral wisdom of denying the sacraments to all living in such a state.

Speaking of persons who are not married and are canonically married, the theologians maintained that there can be very real circumstances because of which certain persons who live in such a co-habitation in a marital state of mind can be morally justified before God and before the Church because they cannot live in any other way.

The original article was accompanied by a footnote in the Homiletic and Pastoral Review which said that it was "the result of much study and many discussions of a fairly large number of moral theologians living in Europe, the U.S.A. and Canada."

"The far greater majority of them," it said, "agreed with the views expressed here."

An editor's note said that to the article one might apply the axiom, "It is better to discuss a problem without settling it, than to settle it without discussion."

McQuaid's John Koller

Rewrote School Records

McQuaid senior John Koller, named this week as a repeater on the All-Catholic basketball squad, did a handy job this season at rewriting the Knights' court record-book.

In all, the 64 centerman put his name next to 9 records and claimed a half share of a tenth. Seven marks were scoring ones, led by his season total of 487 points and his 3-year career total of 802. Both of those records were held by Tony Leonardo, now a sophomore at Canisius. Koller also established new standards in number of field goals (190), game average (24.3), single game total (39), and foul-shooting percentage (74.3). His single-game mark of 15 field goals tied a record set by Leonardo.

Koller's spring and quick hands netted three impressive rebounding records as well. His season total of 362 and game average of 18.1 far outdistanced Leonardo's previous figures, and his single-game figure of 30 rebounds toppled the old mark of 29 set by Gerry McCabe in 1963.

Next month Koller will turn his talents to playing shortstop and pitching for the McQuaid nine. Before then, though, he'll make his final basketball appearance of the year in the All-American high school game in Allentown on April 15.

Although his college plans are still undecided, the 17-year old Brighton resident's range of choices has pretty much narrowed down to Boston College, Pennsylvania, and Niagara.
