There is talk of a full-page ad in the New York Times supporting FIGHT, and there is hope that broader support from the National Council of Churches, other Alinskybacked organizations, and the U.S. Department of Lahor with its influence over Kodak's government contracts-can get Eastman Kodak to change its stand. At this moment, Friends of FIGHT are gathering proxies from Kodak shareholders, and they plan to show up in force at Kodak's annual meeting, April 25, in Flemington, N.J., to the company from

A change in Kodak's position, however, means that Dr. Eilers. visit, would have to have change of heart. The Rochester Council of Churches has pointed out that FIGHT's and Kodak's original proposals are really very close, that the agreement is not an "exclusive" one and that it gives Kodak sufficient control over hiring procedures. Furthermore, there are reports of an ideological split within Kodak itself, and even ardent Kodak friends are a reluctant to believe that an assistant vice přesidént would sign an agreement he was not authorized to sign.
