He noted that parochial schools whose designated purpose is the development of the whole child are by nature suited to this type of school where the differences in many aspects of development are recognized and used in planning highly individualized programs.

Provision in the non-graded school is made for both different rates and variations in the kinds of programs according to needs and abilities.

The professor of education described the process of grouping according to learning needs in contrast to that of grouping according to age or grade.

In individualized grouping the student, he explained, after diagnosis would follow a program ranging from basic to quest education with intermediate and depth education be-

tween these two phases.

Each phase, he stated, would represent the distance the pupil is from the mastery which the teacher has set for that group. In the quest phase, the student, according to Dr. Hillson, would be ready for independent study.

"Creativity and ability to do are not based on IQ's alone," the professor said. He cited other considerations which he labeled IQ's: innate quirks, inner quest, and inner qualities. Professor Hillson recommended unbridling the student so that he can become an ultimate learner.

Among suggested helps to achieving the program, Dr. Hillson mentioned: a creative teacher, a course in library instruction, the making the library central in the learning process, and a multi-textbook approach to study.

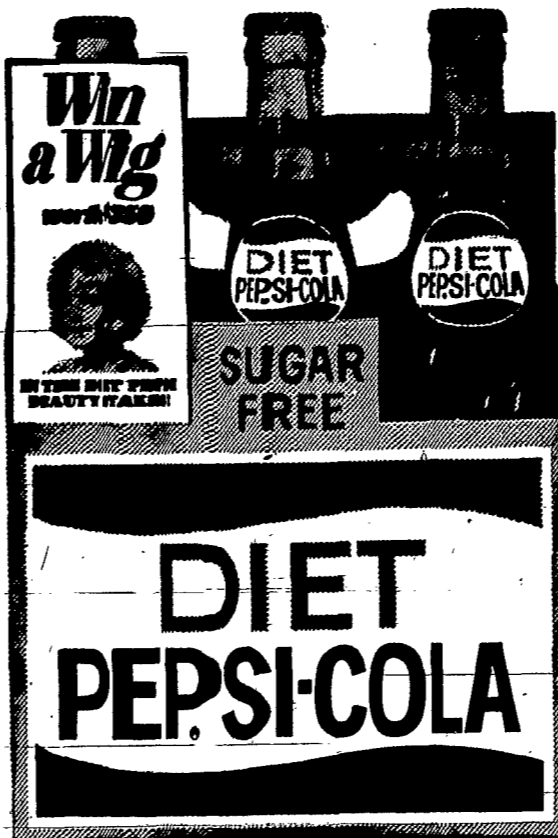
