### Aquinas Track Team Looks Strong

Aquinas Institute, a perennial track powerhouse, has four All-Catholic selections returning among fourteen lettermen. To that number add five harriers from this fall's All Catholic cross-country team and one could say that Father Donald McCarthy has a firm foundation for the construction of a "power mansion."

An overall analysis of this year's Dewey Avenue cinder squad shows strength and depth in the running events, but a very definite lack of point-getting power in the field events.

An event-by-event examination of this year's team, beginning with the sprints, shows All-Catholic returnee Don Hall heading a fairly impressive group of sprinters. Hall is defending Diocesan champion in the 100 and 200 yard dashes. Mike Gruttadauria, Paul Paris and Kevin DeHond follow.

Senior Jerry Schrot is Aquinas' leading low hurdler, but is pushed by three veterans: Roger Donofrio, Mike Ferrin and Don Northrup.

Two senior All-Catholic returnees, Chuck Predmore and Bob Farrell, head the list of 400 men. Predmore won last year's Diocesan in 52.6 seconds. Letterman Jim McCarthy, Steve McCarthy (J Diocesan cham-

One of the projects, expected to be completed this summer, is a \$2.5 million electrostatic accelerator or atom smasher. The 80-ton, 15 million volt machine is four times the size of one currently in use here. It is being built with university and National Science Foundation funds.

The field event picture is brightened considerably by the presence of four pole vaulters who have turned in vaults of more than 10 feet, 6 inches.

All-Catholic selection and defending Diocesan champion Bob Newman is tops with a 12 foot 4 inch vault. Diocesan runnerup Tom Collister (12 feet), Terry Dolan (10 feet, 6 in.) and Mike Hamill (11 ft.) round out the power packed crew.

In the high jump event, veterans Bill Mackey, Mike Kanan and Pete McGuire have all done 5 feet, 6 inches or better.

Senior shot-putter Joe Bulsvs, juniors Derrick Rainey and Tom Mayer shoot in the area of 40 to 43 feet.
