Scouts to Hear Nun

Main speaker at the 20th annual report dinner of the Catholic Committee on Scouting will be a nun, unique in her experience in boy scout activity. She is Sister Mary Andrew Hartman of the Grey Sisters of Ottawa, Canada.

Because of her background, Sister Mary Andrew is called on frequently for addresses to Scouting groups. The acclaim she has received has earned her the Wood Badge Beads, boy scouting's "master degree."

The dinner is scheduled Thursday, April 27 at Vince's 50 Acres, 7500 West Henrietta Road at 8:30 p.m.

PRESENTATION of the St. George Award, the highest Catholic Scouters recognized for their outstanding contribution to youth in the community will be made by Father James M. Moynihan, Chancellor of this diocese.

The principal speaker, Sister Mary Andrew is Associate Professor in Psychology and Education, University of Ottawa; Director of the Counseling Service and Lecturer in Psychology and Sociology, School of Nursing, Pembroke General Hospital; Assistant Professor, School of Religious Studies, University of Ottawa.

She is reported as a great believer in the mutual "breaking of bread" and singing to help develop Scouts and Scouters, psychologically. She has attended more than 45 Scout Conferences and participated in more Wood Badge sessions than virtually any other Scout.

A team of Wood Badge men from Rochester went to hear Sister Mary Andrew's address to more than 600 Scouters at Blue Springs, Ontario. They were enthusiastic with the message and anticipate all who come to hear her will be the same.
