**Movie Actor Priest Heard at Notre Dame**

Father Humberto Almazan, former top Mexican movie star and Academy Award winner, spoke to students and faculty of Notre Dame High School in Elmira recently and celebrated the First Friday Mass for the propagation of the faith.

Father Humberto, a veteran of 21 feature films and over 200 television shows, left stage and screen at the age of 35 to study for the priesthood. He was ordained in 1966, and is a member of a religious order only six years old, founded to assist men to prepare in mid-career for the priesthood: Missionaries of the Holy Apostles.

In his talk, Father Humberto stressed the fact that he, like many others, searched for happiness in the wrong places: fame, wealth, talent and popularity. Only when he turned to God and began giving to others, did he find true joy.

"I don't want to become a priest who just says Masses and his 'breviary' and doesn't get married," said Father Humberto. "I am an actor and I must communicate with people. I must use everything that I have learned as an actor, and all my experience, for young people especially, to capture them for God."

Father will play the leading role in one last feature movie, "Little Guy," the story of Father Miguel Pro, the Jesuit priest who died before the firing squad in Mexico in 1927. He is also planning to lead a tour of Latin American countries from May 27 to June 17 this year.

**Notre Dame High Nuns Receive Study Grants**

Two additional members of the faculty of Notre Dame High School in Elmira have been awarded grants for further study, one for the coming academic year and the other for summer study.

Sister Mary Michael has been awarded a graduate assistantship in theology at the University of Dayton, beginning with the fall term. The assistantship, worth \$2200, will enable her to complete studies for the master's degree in theological studies by June, 1968.

A native of Rochester, Sister M. Michael is a graduate of St. Michael's College, University of Toronto, and has been on the staff at Notre Dame since last fall. She taught formerly at Our Lady of Mercy High School and Cardinal Mooney High School in Rochester.

Sister Mary Dorothy has received a grant under the National Defense Education Act for the Institute for Advanced Spanish at the University of Dayton from June 25 to August 11.

A native of Auburn, Sister M. Dorothy received her B.A. from Niagara University and has pursued graduate work in Spanish at Loyola College in Baltimore, Maryland and at D'Youville College in Buffalo.

She has been a member of the faculty at Notre Dame since September, 1965 and taught formerly in schools in Corning and Rochester.

**'Auxiliary' Priesthood Proposed**

Camden — (RNS) — Limited-service priests, clerics who would take their vows for a period of five to seven years and then could leave the service of the Church "with honor," was suggested here as a possible solution to the Roman Catholic Church's vocation shortage.

Msgr. S. J. Adamo, executive editor of the Catholic Star Herald, official publication of the Diocese of Camden, made the proposal in his regular weekly column.

"Sacramentally a man becomes a priest forever, true," he wrote. "But he need not exercise his priesthood always. Sometimes he leaves and sometimes the Church asks him to leave. In either case he no longer functions as a priest."

Msgr. Adamo's plan would be to urge "men with suitable educational backgrounds and good character" to become celibate priests for a period of five to seven years only. After that time they "need not renew their vows and may leave with honor," he said.

"In that way, the ideal of a celibate clergy is maintained with a constant number of good men continuously being drawn to it for at least a portion of their lives," Msgr. Adamo said.

Under his plan, such priests would also be allowed to renew their vows for two additional periods of five to seven years and after that total period of 15 to 21 years they would have to "decide whether they want to stay for keeps." Those who do should be the ones considered for pastorates and bishoprics, he said.

**Inadequate Social Security**

**Aged 'Locked in Poverty'**

Washington—(RNS)—Even if a proposed increase is approved by Congress, Social Security payments will still be inadequate, a spokesman for the National Conference of Catholic Charities told the House Ways and Means Committee.

Msgr. Lawrence J. Corcoran, secretary of the NCCC, said that Social Security increases proposed in H.R. 5710, "even though they will be helpful, still fall far short of what is needed for a decent level of existence."

His testimony was given on behalf of the U.S. Catholic Conference (formerly the NCWC) as well as the Charities Conference.

The proposed amendment "will keep some aged persons locked in poverty," he said.

"The increase should bring benefits to the poverty level of \$1,600 for individuals and \$3,100 annually for a family of four." Instead, he noted, many individuals will receive "only the minimum of \$70 per month. This is \$840 per year, only half the amount needed for a person to be outside the category of an impoverished person."

He recommended an average increase in benefits of at least 50 per cent rather than the 20 per cent provided in the amendment.

At present, he pointed out, 33 states give their welfare recipients "less than the level which has been established by the state itself as necessary to meet basic human needs." He commended a provision in the new bill which would require states to meet these standards.

"Thus," he said, "a state which establishes a standard for minimum subsistence at \$223.87 for a family of four, can no longer pay that family \$110, or 49 per cent of minimum need."

He also praised provisions which would require states to set their standards according to the current cost of living and measures which would encourage welfare recipients to find work to supplement the public funds they receive.

**Dialogue Set With Marxists**

New York—(RNS)—A Christian-Marxist dialogue has been scheduled for the first time behind the Iron Curtain, according to the noted Marxist theoretician, Dr. Roger Garaudy.

The meeting of Communists and Christians will take place at the end of April in Prague, Czechoslovakia, stated Dr. Garaudy, who is professor of philosophy in the University Institute in Poitiers and a member of the Politburo of the French Communist Party.

Dr. Garaudy said that the encounter will occur at a meeting in the Czech capital of the Paulus Gesellschaft or Pauline Society. The society is a group of German-speaking Roman Catholic scholars that has sponsored annual conferences in various cities of West Germany during the past four years.

The French Marxist philosopher made his announcement at a press conference here sponsored by Manhattan College. Dr. Garaudy was a participant in a two-day convocation inaugurating the college's Pacem in Terris Institute.
