## Canterbury Prelate Visits French Abbey

Rouen—(RNS)—The Archbishop of Canterbury joined Joseph Marie Cardinal Martin, Archbishop of Rouen, in prayers and conversation in a historic meeting at the 900-year-old Benedictine Abbey of Bec.

Dr. Arthur Michael Ramsey was the first Anglican Primate ever to be received officially by a French cardinal and the first Archbishop of Canterbury to visit France officially since 1520 when Archbishop William Wareham accompanied King Henry VIII to a meeting with King Francis I of France.

The prelates held lengthy private conversations on Church unity after attending together a Pontifical Mass marking the Feast of St. Anselm.

## The Church in the World Prophetic, Not Talkative

The Hague—(NC)—The right and duty of Christian churches to be involved in international affairs was strongly defended by 60 lay and clerical leaders attending a six-day, top-level consultation here sponsored by the World Council of Churches (WCC).

The group declared, however, that the "churches are not required to maintain a running commentary on the international newsreel. A talkative church is not thereby a prophetic church, and there are times to keep silent."

The consultation was called specifically to review the work of the WCC's Commission of Churches on International Affairs (CCIA), which was organized in 1946 and became an agency of the WCC in 1948.

Proposals based on findings of the consultation will be submitted for action to the WCC central committee, when it meets at Crete in August.

"The primary criterion for determining when the Church should speak," said the group, "derives from the concern of the church for man in the light of the Gospel—whenever there are threats to human life or possibilities for its enrichment."

Especially when nobody else speaks in such situations, the voice of the church should be heard. When, again, the truth is known but not respected, or men will not dare utter it, the church has the duty to declare it."

The group's report said the churches must be thoroughly informed about the issues on which they speak, and at the same time "have the courage to risk being wrong."
