25 Years Ago

(From Catholic Courier Files, May 7, 1942)

Diocese of Rochester was planning to join in a world-wide prayer observance of Pope Pius XII's silver jubilee of consecration as a Bishop. Bishop Kearney was to celebrate Solemn Pontifical Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral to launch prayers for the "apostle of peace."

Father John V. Loughlin, professor of Education and Librarian at St. Bernard's Seminary enlisted in the U.S. Navy as a chaplain, the fifteenth priest of the diocese of Rochester to enter the armed forces in World War II.

Thirteen sets of brothers were represented among 86 names of young men from St. Anthony Parish, Elmira in the Armed forces of the United States.

Diamond Jubilee of Nursing School, Theme of St. Mary's Alumnae Event

The Diamond Jubilee of St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing will be the theme of the Alumnae Dinner Dance on Friday, May 12 at Logan's, Scottsville Road. Mrs. James Woodward is chairman. Social hour will be followed by a dinner and dance.

St. Mary's Hospital, the first hospital to be established in the city of Rochester, was founded by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincen de Paul in 1857.

The program was extended to three years in 1897. St. Mary's was registered by the Board of Regents in 1905, and since that time has graduated 1,814 nurses.

In 1962 the curriculum was revised to include affiliation with Monroe Community College for courses in the science

and humanities. The School of Nursing received its full accreditation from the National League in 1958. St. Mary's is also a member of the Conference of Catholic Schools of Nursing.
