"POP" QUICK EGG CURRY

- 3 tablespoons Blue Bonnet Margarine
 - 1/4 cup minced onion
 - 3 tablespoons flour
 - 2 teaspoons curry powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
 - 2 cups milk
 - 6 hard-cooked eggs, sliced
 - 1 1/2 cups cooked or canned peas, drained
 - 1 can (4 oz.) pimientos, drained and chopped
 - 2 (4 oz.) bags WISE POTATO CHIPS, crumbled
- Melt Blue Bonnet in heavy skillet; add onion and cook over low heat until tender but not brown, stirring occasionally, about 3 to 5 minutes.
- Mix flour with curry, salt and pepper; add onion mixture and cook until frothy, stirring frequently. Stir in milk, a little at a time; cook over low heat until thickened, stirring occasionally; fold in eggs, reheat if necessary.
- Combine hot peas and pimientos with crumbled Wise Potato Chips; arrange as a ring on preheated platter. Pour egg mixture in center; serve immediately. Serves 6.

ROYAL CITRUS DESSERT

(6-8 servings)

- 1 cup diced orange sections
 - 1 cup diced grapefruit sections
 - 1/4 cup sugar
 - 1 pkg. ROYAL ORANGE GELATIN
 - 1 cup boiling water
 - 1 tbl. grated orange rind
 - 1/4 cup chopped maraschino cherries
 - 1/4 cup chopped pecans (or black walnuts)
- Combine orange and grapefruit; sprinkle with sugar. Let stand about 15 minutes. Dissolve Royal Orange Gelatin in boiling water. Drain sweetened fruit, measuring fruit juice and adding water to make 1/4 cup. Add juice mixture and orange rind to gelatin. Chill until very thick. Fold in orange, grapefruit, cherries, and nuts. Spoon into 1 quart mold. Chill until firm. Unmold just before serving. Serve with whipped cream.

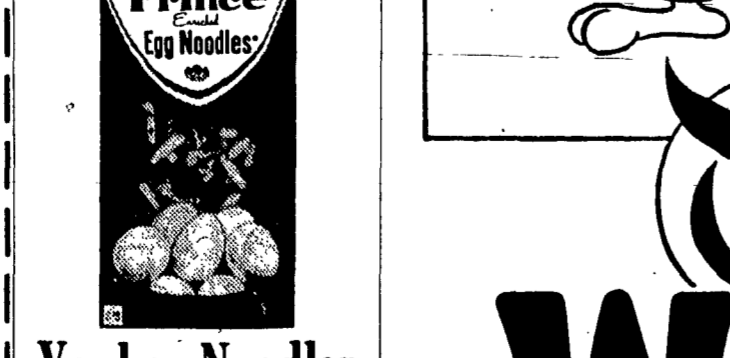
