Campion League Topped By Lourdes Debaters

Four young orators from Our Lady of Lourdes grammar school defeated St. John the Evangelist A squad in the final round of the Blessed Edmund Campion Grammar School Debate League at McQuaid High School Sunday to finish the season's competition in first place with an impressive 20-8 record.

Members of the squad are: William Keenan, Richard Sheridan, Paul Brayer, all eighth graders, and Mike Mahoney, a seventh grader. Second place in overall competition went to St. John the Evangelist A squad, with a 19-9 record, while St. John the Evangelist B squad struck together 18 victories against 10 defeats to capture third place.

FULL FOUR YEAR scholarships were also awarded to the best boy and girl speakers at the conclusion of the 9 month competition. Both scholarships are based on need and will be awarded to the next highest student if the winners have no need of financial aid.

An attractive young girl from St. Anne's, Judi Skelly, won the girl's scholarship by finishing as the best speaker in the 106 member league. Judi, an honor student at the St. Anne's school, will have a choice of attending either St. Agnes or Mercy High School.

The full scholarship to McQuaid was awarded to a 12-year old transplant from Louisville, Kentucky, Mike Mahoney, since the top boy speaker, David Hayes of Blessed Sacrament, will attend Aquinas on an oratory scholarship won in October. Mike is a seventh grader at Our Lady of Lourdes grammar school.

The Campion League, founded and directed by McQuaid Jesuit High School, is the only such league devoted to grade school students in the state. McQuaid debaters provide both coaching and judging and all competition is held at the Clinton Avenue School.
