Charles Salamone, Father Of 2 City Doctors, Dies

Funeral Mass for Charles (Colgero) Salamone, father of two Rochester doctors was offered by Father Joseph P. Bechini in St. Francis Xavier Church, Wednesday, May 9.

St. died Saturday, May 6, 1957 after suffering a stroke while visiting a daughter in Atlanta, Ga.

Born in Sicily, Mr. Salamone came to Rochester alone in 1902 at the age of 16. He operated a barber shop on East Main St. near Chamberlain St. for many years before retiring about 30 years ago.

Through his work and various real estate investment, Mr. Salamone provided for several of his sons' college educations.

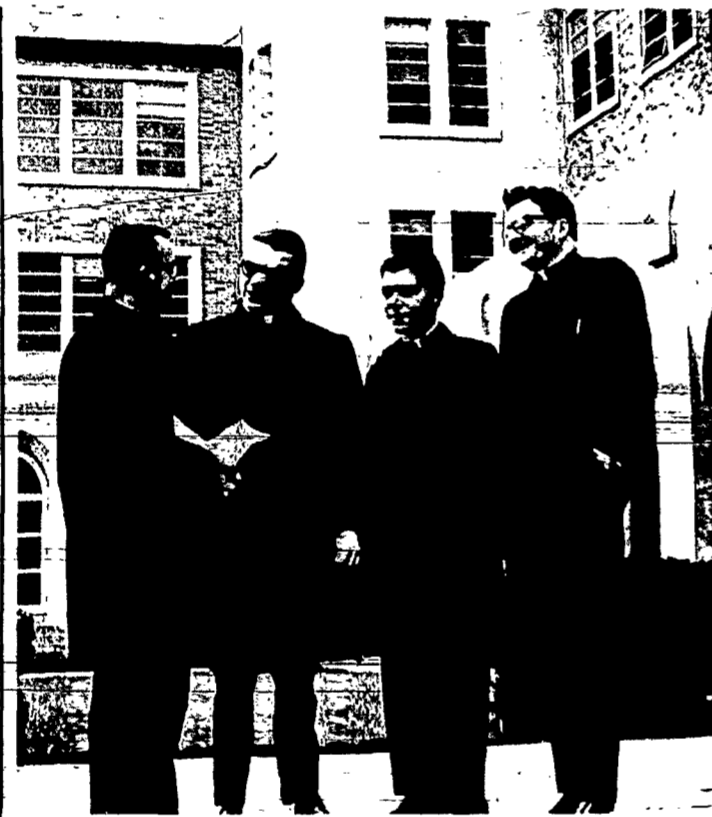
This is the first time that the New York State Association of Student Councils has been invited to assist the Commissioner of Education in such a project.

The Notre Dame Crusaders of Elmira defeated Corning-Painted Post East, but lost to Athens last week to give them a 3-4 baseball season to date.

The Notre Dame-East game was a genuine thriller. The Crusaders scored twice in the first on Larry Comereski's scoring triple and an error. East tied it with single runs in the sixth and seventh and then each team scored a run in the ninth.

Tom Russell led off the 10th inning with his triple and scored on Pete DeSocio's follow-up three-bagger to enable reliever John Bodeves to pick up the pitching victory for ND, 4-3.

Athens, which nipped Notre Dame earlier in the baseball season, did it again last Friday, using a seven-run third inning to edge the Crusaders, 8-7.

Despite its big third inning which overcame a 5-0 Notre Dame lead, Athens' deciding run came in the fourth when Gary Fairbanks belted the first pitch of reliever Dan McCarthy for a home run. Pete DeSocio homered for Notre Dame and Tom Russell went three for three and stole three bases.

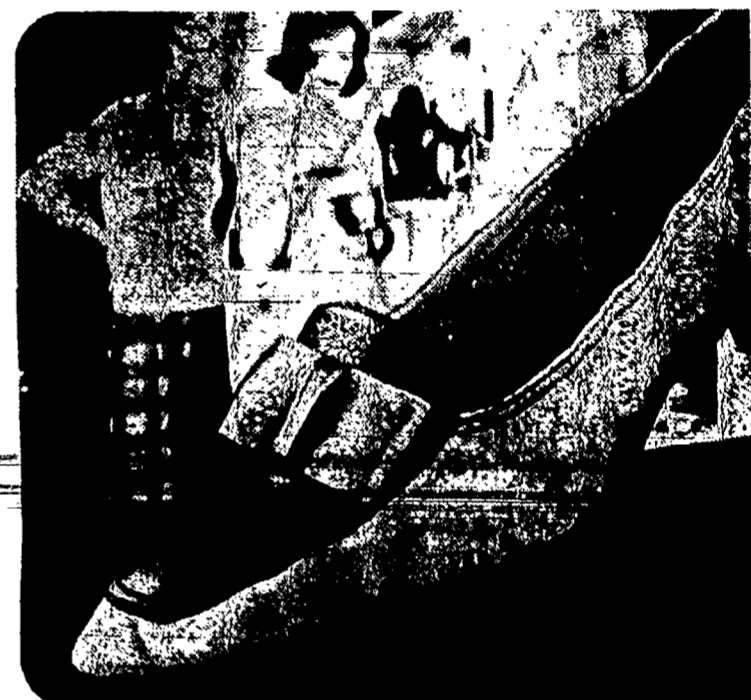
