

## Mission Bishops to Visit

Missionary Bishops from nine countries in Asia, four countries in Africa and four countries in Latin America are visiting the Diocese of Rochester this year. Monsignor John F. Duffy, Diocesan Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith made this announcement as he submitted a report to Bishop Sheen.

"During the summer and fall of last year, at least eighty Missionary Bishops applied for admission to the Missionary Cooperation Plan for 1967," the diocesan director explained. "It was through this Diocesan Mission Office," Monsignor Duffy continued, "that these Bishops asked the Bishop of Rochester for permission to preach in some parishes and to take up a collection."

In 1966 the one hundred fifty-two parishes participating in the Plan contributed a total of \$92,000, averaging \$242 for each set or group of four parishes. To enable practically every parish in the diocese to hear a sermon from a visiting missionary, the parishes are arranged in groups of four. And the four parishes in each group vary in size.

"A good example of an average group in 1966 was that in which St. Louis' parish in Pitts-

ford contributed the amount of \$1515 and St. Catherine's parish in Addison gave \$134. The other two parishes in the group were St. Mary's in Corning with \$946 and St. Charles Borrowed in Elmira Heights giving \$286. A total of \$2482 was realized from this set of four parishes," the director observed.

"It was but a few weeks after his installation that Bishop Sheen expressed to me the wish that this year, on an experimental basis, the people of the Diocese have the opportunity to hear of the needs of the Missionary Bishops," the diocesan director revealed. "And so to carry out the Bishop's wish, the Diocesan Office sent Aerogramme letters to all of the eighty Bishops who had already made application for 1967," Monsignor Duffy continued. The letters were intended to sound out the Bishops about the possibility of their personally visiting the United States some time during 1967.

Because the diocesan mission director considered it impractical for a Missionary Bishop to come to this country for only these four parish collections, the letter to the Missionary Bishops was phrased in these words: "If your schedule at present will bring you to the United

States between now and December 15th, we have sets of parishes—four in each set—to be allocated to Missionary Bishops."

The first Missionary Bishop to visit the Diocese and to complete his four parish visitations was Bishop Caesar Gatimu of the Diocese of Nyeri in Kenya. Bishop Gatimu's visit realized the sum of \$3155 from four parishes, all in Rochester: St. Joseph's, St. James', the Annunciation and St. Theresa's.

According to the present timetable the last Bishop to come will be Bishop Peter Carretto of the Diocese of Raburi in Thailand. Bishop Carretto will preach in Holy Family, Holy Redeemer and St. Philip Neri parishes in Rochester and in St. Bernard's parish in Scipio.

"Even this early in the season, I have observed a definite interest and curiosity on the part of our people," Monsignor Duffy said. "From casual, chance conversations with the people whose parishes have already been visited by these Bishops, I have discovered that our people are thinking about more than their own parishes, their own dioceses, their own country. They are thinking about the world. And this is a healthy sign" the Director noted.
