**Foley Fund Agency Adds Census Service**

Broader services particularly to Catholic institutions is the aim of a merger announced this week by a Rochester fund-raising organization and a Washington, D.C., census consulting firm.

John J. Foley of Rochester, who heads the combined counseling organization, said Foley Associates Inc., Rochester-based fund-raising firm, will operate as a division of Census Management Inc., Washington, with headquarters in the capital city and branch office in Rochester.

Foley Associates has assisted for the last 14 years in raising more than \$800 million in 84 dioceses in the U.S. and Canada. The firm has participated in 147 fund campaigns for parishes and institutions in the Rochester Diocese, including the recent \$10,500,000 Joint College Fund drive for St. John Fisher and Nazareth Colleges.

Census Management, 1700 Pennsylvania Ave., Washington, since 1964 has serviced church and independent groups, both nationally and regionally, in census programs, attitudinal surveys, management services and membership programs.

The firm recently completed several diocesanwide Catholic censuses, is currently conducting a census and attitudinal survey of Catholics in Fort Smith, Ark., and is preparing a similar program for the Diocese of Grand Rapids, Mich.

Foley noted that the merger will provide multiple counseling services to dioceses, institutions and parishes.
