Aquinas Former Coaches To Fete Father Carter

Eight Aquinas head football coaches, spanning a period of twenty-five years are expected to be among the guests attending a "testimonial dinner" June 11 for Aquinas athletic director Father Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B.
Sponsored by friends and alumni of Aquinas, the dinner will be held at Vince's Fifty Acres in Henrietta. The occasion marks twenty five years of service by Father Carter to Aquinas and the Rochester community.
Heading the list of returning coaches is John Sullivan who founded football at Aquinas in 1931. It was during his time that Father-Carter was appointed to Aquinas. When Sullivan left in 1945 he had compiled a formidable 67 won, 27 lost, 8 tie record.
Harry Wright followed Sullivan from 1946 to 1948, registering 18 wins against 3 losses and 2 ties. Mickey Connolly's reign lasted from 1949 to 1951. He had a 21-3 record. A two year stint by Ray Jablonski netted a 7-6-1 performance. Stan Zajdel in 1954 and Hunk Vadas the following year both had 3-5 records. Former professional football player Joe Repko took over in 1956 and in nine years accumulated a 37-31-1 record. Present coach Bob Rosmarino is 12 and 4 over two years.
When Aquinas expanded its football program in 1945, Coach Harry Wright elevated Aquinas to lofty heights as the games shifted from Edgerton Park to Red Wing Stadium and teams began their invasion—coming from Texas, Illinois, Connecticut, New Jersey and Nebraska. Wire services used to telegraph Aquinas' name throughout the country at each successive victory.
In 1949 the 22,000 seat Aquinas Stadium was dedicated and Coach Mickey Connolly forged ahead to tangle with teams stamped with national calibre.
1952 saw a change in school policy at Aquinas and football was de-emphasized. More recently Aquinas has regained its supremacy in local competition.
