Interfaith Center Board Elects New Chairman

Geneseo—H. Kelsey Bicknell, recently elected chairman of the board of Geneseo's Interfaith Center, has been active with the group since its inception two years ago.

He succeeds Dr. Spencer J. Roemer who has served as chairman since the group was formally incorporated in February, 1965.

The Interfaith Center board's incorporation was the result of a need expressed by local college students, clergy and laymen for a local meeting place which could embrace those of all faiths. A \$300,000 fund drive for an Interfaith Center has achieved more than one third of its goal, according to Dr. Roemer.

Plans for the new executive board will focus on starting construction of the center for educational activities. A site on Franklin street has been purchased and cleared.

Other newly elected officers are Richard T. Haviland, vice chairman; Dr. Nicholas P. LaGatuta, recording secretary; Clarence N. Kimber, corresponding secretary; and Donald W. Trasher, re-elected as treasurer.

Sr. Mary Catherine Rites Held at Motherhouse

Funeral Mass for Sister Mary Catherine (Sullivan) was celebrated by Monsignor Albert H. Schnacky with Father J. Norman Margrett at Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse, Pittsford, May 26.

Sister Mary Catherine, former teacher in parochial schools died unexpectedly, at the Motherhouse, Tuesday morning, May 23, 1967.

Attending the Requiem Mass were Monsignor Leo V. Smith, Father James E. Boyle, and Father Patrick J. Logan.

Born Mary Sullivan, she taught in St. Patrick's Cathedral Grammar School before she entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1931 from that parish. After her training period in religion, Sister Mary Catherine taught at St. Bridget's School from 1933-1938 at which time illness forced her to retire from teaching. Since then, she has been a helper at the Motherhouse in various departments.

Surviving are four sisters, the Misses Elizabeth, Catherine and Margaret Sullivan, and Mrs. William Kelly, also several nieces and nephews.

At the grave, the last blessing was given by Father Logan.

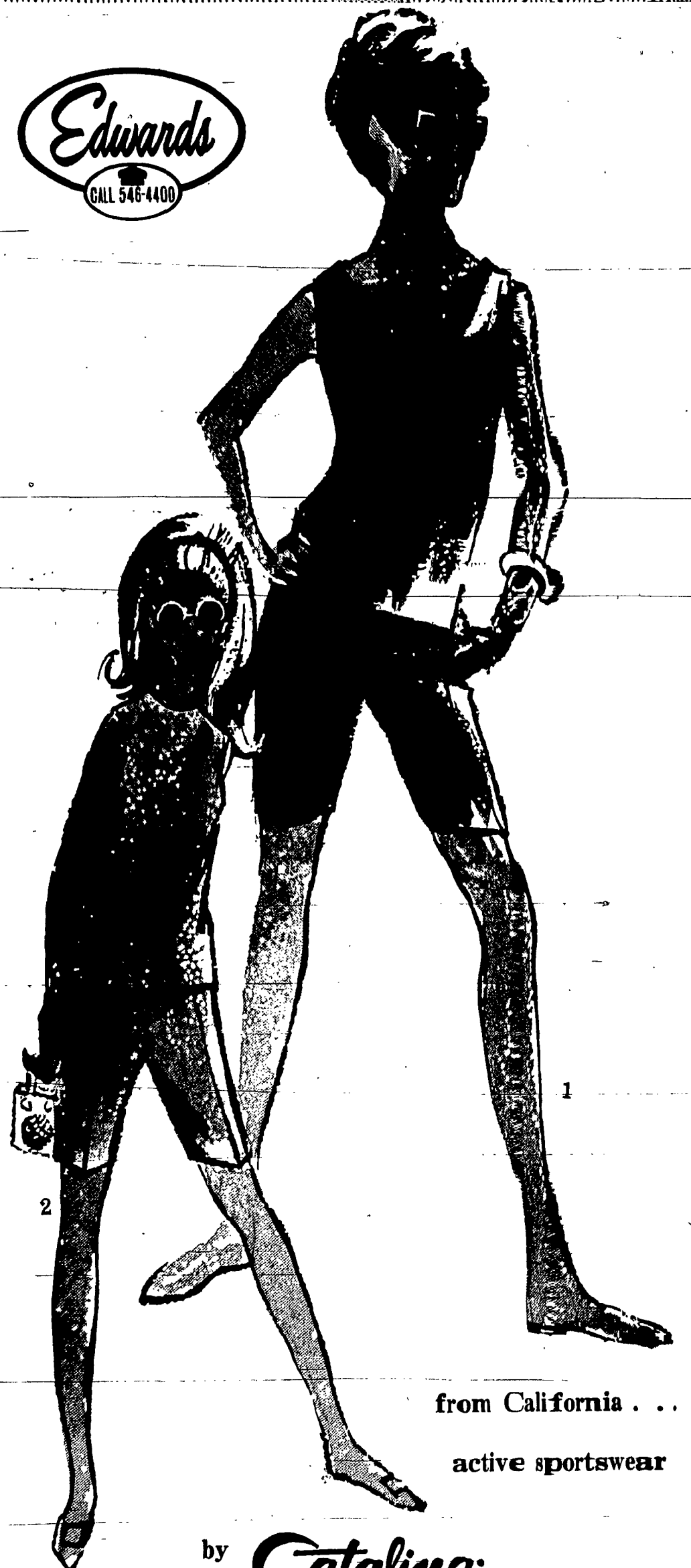
