

Rochester Maryknoll Given Mission

Father Thomas J. Samway, of Rochester will be ordained a priest of the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America Saturday, June 10, at the Maryknoll Seminary, Maryknoll, N.Y.

Father Samway will offer his first solemn Mass, Sunday, July 18 at 1:30 p.m., at Mother of Sorrows Church, Greece, with Rev. George S. Wood, pastor, assisting.

Father Samway has been assigned to Maryknoll's missions in Peru, and will receive his mission crucifix on Sunday, June 11, along with other newly ordained classmates who are departing for the missions.

A reception will be held immediately following the Mass in the parish hall.

Father Samway attended Van Antwerp Junior High School and graduated from the Linton High School, both in Schenectady, Siena College, the Maryknoll College in Glen Ellyn, Ill., and Maryknoll Seminary.

While in the seminary, Father Samway worked with a tutorial program on the lower-East

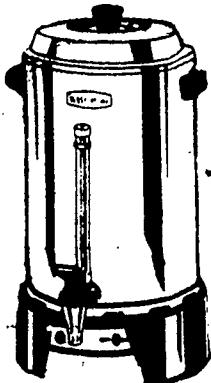

Speaking of recipes, here's one that's sure to delight the spring-time palate.

GOLDEN CLUBHOUSE SANDWICH ("POP" Version) (6 sandwiches)

Breading Mixture:

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup enriched flour
- 1/2 cup cornflake crumbs

Sandwich:

- 12 slices bacon, partially cooked
- 6 slices (2 oz. each) chicken breast
- Salt, pepper and monosodium glutamate
- 6 hamburger buns, toasted
- BLUE BONNET MARGARINE, softened
- 6 lettuce leaves
- 6 tomato slices
- 1/4 cup Thousand Island dressing

Crisscross 2 bacon slices. Place one chicken slice in center of bacon slices, fold bacon over chicken, pressing lightly. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and MSG. Blend eggs and milk together. Dip both sides of chicken in flour, then in egg mixture, then in cornflake crumbs. Press crumbs lightly into meat.
