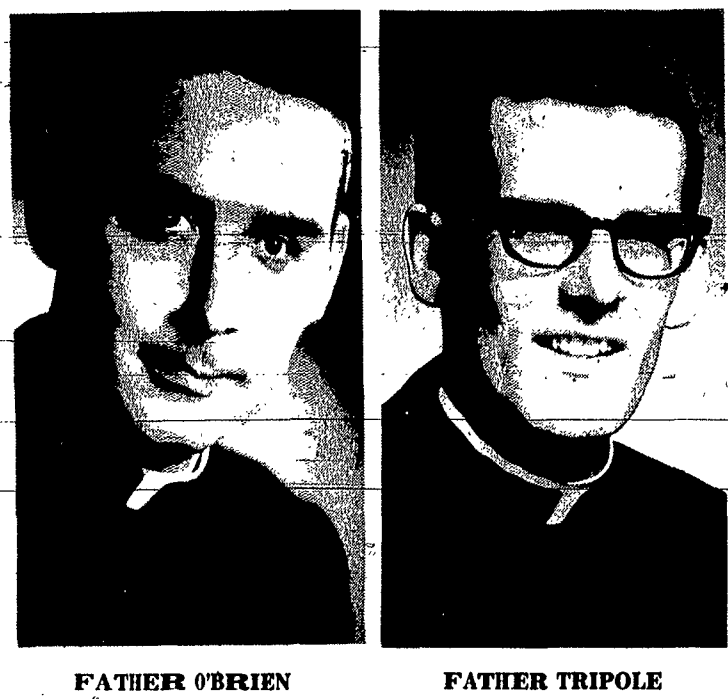
Father O'Brien attended Corpus Christi school, Aquinas Institute, Holy Cross College, Fordham University, Regis College and LeMoine College.

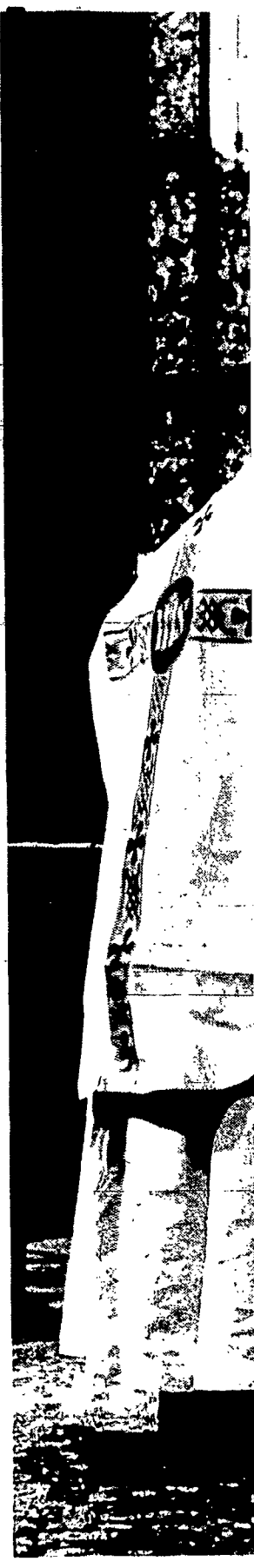
