



## Fisher Summer Session Top Enrollment Seen

Based on inquiries received and pre-registration, the largest enrollment in history is expected at the St. John Fisher College Summer Session this year, according to Dr. Charles J. Meder, director.

He estimates that more than 500 men and women from approximately 100 colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada will be on hand to choose from among 60 courses covering 16 fields of study that will be offered at Fisher this summer. Additional courses will be available at Nazareth College. The Summer Session is a cooperative venture of the two local colleges, and all courses are coeducational.

Courses are being offered in biology, chemistry, economics, English, German, Spanish, education, finance, history, mathematics, philosophy, physics, psychology, political science, sociology, and theology. Most lectures will be given in air-conditioned St. Basil Hall.

Two five-week day sessions, a six-week evening session are scheduled at St. John Fisher. Registration for the first five-week day session will be June 12. Registration for the six-week day and evening courses will be June 23 and 24.

Among the many new course offerings in the Fisher schedule is Theology 402, "The Catholic Church in the Secular City," in which the relationship of the Church to contemporary urban social and economic problems will be examined. The course will be taught by Dr. Noel B. Schull, who will join the Fisher theology department on a full-time basis in September and evening courses will be.

**Gregorian Noted Music**

The Gregorian Institute diocesan - sponsored liturgical music seminar scheduled for August 29 to September 1, will be open to all diocesan church teachers, organ and music supervisors, those from surrounding dioceses. Requests for information already been received from states and from Canada. P. Indications point to a weekend session.

Among the prominent diocesan faculty members who will lecture during the conference will be the known New York musician Grady, who is distinguished only for his achievement as a music director at the Nations Holy Family Church, which was visited by Pope John in October, 1965, but for the position he holds as diocesan organist of the Metropolitan Opera, Lincoln Center.

Grady will give an introductory course in Church Organ and Parish Service emphasizing the following: ground necessary for the modern Catholic Church; knowledge of repair and style appropriate to the service; norms of selection; provision and control of devices; conducting both diocesan and at the key.

Service playing; how to hymns effectively; how to play at wedding funerals; how to use the Sunday High Mass; the Sunday Low Mass; do about "filler" music to accompany a choir and gregation; an exploration of various chants, psalms, that an organist would encounter and how to accompany.

Other lecture and demonstration courses will include treatment of such subjects as the Musical notation of Vatican II; Rev. Richard Wojcik, Archdiocesan Music Com of Chicago; Verma Can Choir Rehearsal Proceed Wayne Belton, prominent organist of the Gregorian Institute; and Speech Dictation Choral Technique with reading sessions.
