Father Leo Welch, S.J., a native of Webster, is back from the Philippines for a two months vacation.

Son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Welch, he is in charge of the physics department of Xavier University in the city of Cagayande-Oro on the island of Mindanao. School vacation

months in the Philippines are May and June.

Father Welch first went to the Philippines in 1930 and stayed for two years studying typhoons and other weather characteristics in the tropics.

On his return he studied meteorology for another two years in the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Veterans Rap Flag Burners

Catholic War Veterans of Elmira Heights, recently voted their protest against "draft card burners, flag burners, draft dodgers and many misguided and misinformed Americans" and resolved to "stand firmly and fixed behind our country in its overseas commitments."

Raymond Coyles, commander, and William Kowlich, post-adjutant, signed the statement.

In 1939, he returned to the Philippines for the second time and was connected with the Manila Observatory and the Philippine Weather Bureau. From 1942 to February 1945, he was at the Los Banos internment camp for civilian aliens of Japan. After liberation he spent one year in this country, teaching at Canisius High School in Buffalo. Since 1946 he has been in the Philippines.

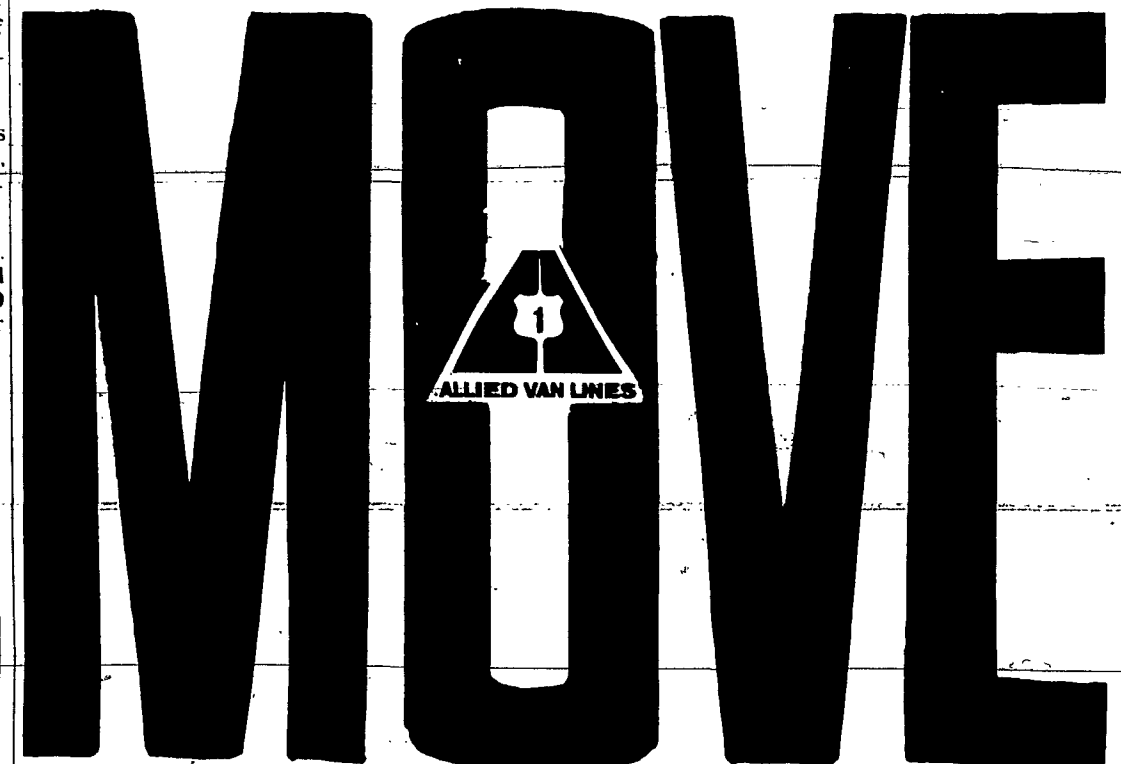
