Now that the hot weather is finally here, there's sure to be a rush for those good old standbys—hot and cold cuts. Both Maplecrest and Russers provide a wide variety of these. ### QUICK TOMATO ASPIC (6 servings)

- 1 pkg. ROYAL LEMON GELATIN
- 1 1/2 cups hot water
- 3 tbl. HUNT'S TOMATO PASTE
- 5 tbl. cold water
- 1 1/2 tbl. vinegar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- Dash pepper
- 1/4 tsp. onion salt or celery salt

Dissolve Royal Lemon Gelatin in hot water and add Hunt's Tomato Paste (which has been mixed with the cold water). Stir in remaining ingredients. Blend well. Pour into individual molds and chill until firm. Serve on crisp greens.

If you want to dress up your tomato aspic, fold in chopped ripe olives or layer hard-cooked egg slices in the molds when the aspic is very thick.

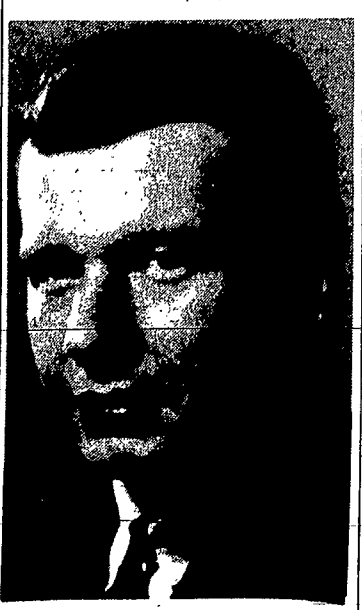
