**Diocesan Champs**

**Kearney Captures Track Title**

Bishop Kearney High's trackmen, aided by a last event win by Aquinas, narrowly edged McQuaid 75 to 73 to win the Diocesan track and field championships at McQuaid's oval last Monday.

McQuaid needed to win the 880-yard relay, last event of the day, to tie Kearney for the meet, but couldn't do it as Aquinas took the event. The McQuaid quartet had a 10-yard lead going into the final leg, but Mike Gruttadauria of Aquinas roared in like a Derby winner to sew up the event for the Irish.

In winning, the Kings set five meet records, paced by John Numetko, who set new marks in both the triple jump and high jump.

Other Kearney stars who set new records were Mike Kelly with a 9:32.9 two mile, Jim Neary with a 51.7 quarter mile and Rick Magere with a discus throw of 135 feet. Magere was the second King double winner, taking a first in the short put as well.

McQuaid had the meet's other double champion in senior Dave Meyer, who captured both hurdle events, the 120 high hurdles in a record 15.7. Mooney's Otis Davis added a sixth record with a 220 victory in 22.5 seconds.

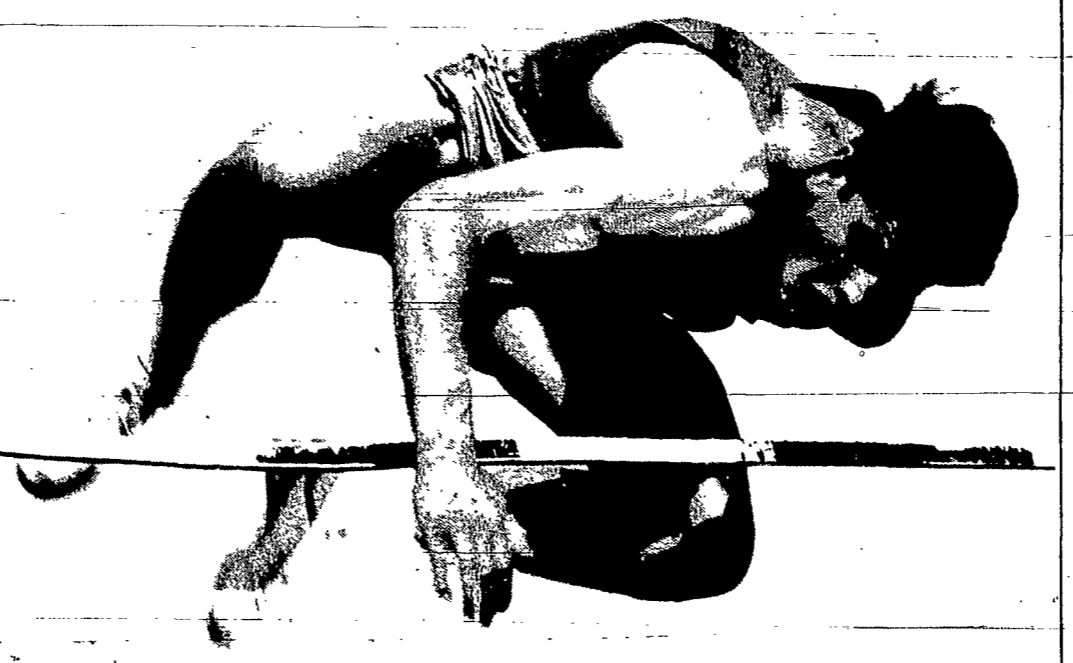
relay team of Aquinas, which finished with a 3:45.9 time.

Highlighting the victory for Kearney in its first year under Coach Frank Loiacono were 1-2 and 1-3 finishes in the high jump and triple jump and a big 1-3-4 in the two-mile run, where freshman Mike D'Errico and soph Jeff Eichner ran strongly behind Kelly.

Though six of last year's winners were in the meet, only Bob Newman of Aquinas repeated as champion, taking the pole vault. Neary, triple jump and mile winner in '66, switched events this year, while Mooney's Jim Harrington and Aquinas' Don Hall and Chuck Pedrone all were edged out of the top spots they gained a year ago.

The meet was directed by Penfield coach Terry Foley who originated the Diocesan meet while at McQuaid in 1962. He was assisted by a battery of coaches from county schools.
