

A Friend Returns for a Blessing

Hammondsport—
"Boyhood dreams of long ago
Saw an altar fair,
Consecrated, trembling hands
Lifted there in prayer.
And those dreams have led
me on,
Dreamlike though they
seemed.
Now, dear friend, thank God
with me,
I am what I dreamed."

These words penned anon-
ymously by a newly ordained
priest several years ago, per-
meated the thoughts of this

correspondent on Thursday,
June 8, as three young men,
ordained to the holy priesthood
just five days before in Roch-
ester, visited this small hamlet
and celebrated Mass.

This was a historical mile-
stone for St. Gabriel's Church
here and an occasion of special
spiritual enrichment for those
who attended the Mass, par-
ticularly for a few of the mem-
bers present who were witness-
ing a consecration for the first time.

There was another significant
fact noted that added a quality
of ecumenical spirit to the oc-
casion... the presence at Mass

of a devout Methodist woman,
confined to a wheelchair, who
had requested her Catholic
friends to bring her so she
might receive the first blessings
of these newly ordained priests.

Presiding celebrant at the
Mass was Father Lewis Brown
of Millport, who as a helpful
seminarian last summer en-
deared himself to young and
old, Catholic and Protestants, in
the Hammondsport area when
he spent two months here as-
sisting St. Gabriel's pastor, Fa-
ther Edward J. Tolster. The
other two concelebrants were
Father Vincent Panepinto of
Rochester's Our Lady of Mt.
Carmel parish, and Father Rob-

ert W. Hammond of St. Ignatius
Loyola parish, Hornell. The
three young men were class-
mates at St. Bernard's Seminary
and were ordained at Sacred
Heart Cathedral by Bishop
Sheen June 3.

Mass chosen for the concele-
bration was the "Voice Mass
for Peace." Father Tolster was
in the sanctuary and Ken Per-
kins and Ted Kulkowski served
as altar boys.

Following the Mass, Fathers
Brown, Hammond, and Panep-
into gave their first blessings
to those who attended.
