Poster Ridicules Christ

MACAO—(RNS)—Roman Catholics here of European origin are demanding a vigorous protest against the latest propaganda assault of Macao's Red-Guard-style Maoist youths.

A protest must be made, according to these Catholics, even if it leads to rioting by the Red Guards.

Their complaint is directed at 12-foot poster caricaturing Christ which the Red Guards have pasted to a wall of St. Joseph's School here. The poster shows Christ brandishing a sword from which blood drips.

It was raised as a backdrop for the latest demonstration at the school in the center of Macao, the object of violent attacks from Maoists for more than a month now.

During the demonstration, 100 students milled around the school shouting, installing, reading aloud from "The Thoughts of Mao-Tse-Tung" and singing revolutionary songs. Some climbed ladders to the second floor to cover the wall with painted slogans and posters in large characters.

The attacks on St. Joseph's, which the Maoists accuse of having a "nationalist agent" on its faculty, have been escalating steadily. Most people in Macao think that the school currently closed for summer vacation, will not reopen through school officials say that it will.

St. Joseph's is thought to be the first target in an extensive

campaign against all non-Communist schools in the small Portuguese enclave.

In the absence of Bishop Paulo Jose Tavares, who is out of Macao on a mandatory home leave, Catholic authorities have made no attempt to remove the insulting poster for fear of inciting violence.

Portuguese authorities, who nominally rule the small colony, have remained silent and inactive on this occasion as on others recently.

Before placement of the poster attacking Christ, the Red Guards exhibited a series of provocative posters attacking, in turn, public officials, missionaries and Pope Paul.

Most Christians in Macao are of Chinese origin. So far, none of their spokesmen has publicly stated a position on the ques-
